Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Grace to you and peace from God the Father and our Lord Jesus Christ, Amen.

St. Paul tells his readers in his first letter to the Thessalonian Church to “Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you” (1 THESS 5:16-18). A difficult instruction for many of us.

When the world is weighing heavy on our shoulders it is sometimes difficult to rejoice, to pray, to give thanks. Yet, Paul holds this out for the follower of Christ as a goal for a faithful life. A lofty goal, yes, but a goal.

In this month's Pastor's corner I want to look at the prayer aspect of our lives. Often I get asked to pray for a person. “Pastor, my friend is sick would you pray”, or, “Pastor, someone is going through a rough time, would you keep them in your prayers?” Now, I am sure I am not the only one who gets these requests. Most of us are happy to offer prayer for someone struggling, or a person that is ill. I was thinking the other night that in all of my years of ministry I have only heard the results of those prayers a few times. Sometimes, I would like to know if a person recovered, or if their situation has improved.

We are quick to pray in crisis, we are quick to pray in chaos - but how often do we see God active in our everyday lives touching our lives and others? I believe with all of my being that God is doing mighty, busy, active things in our world, we just don't often take the time to notice.

You may have heard me talking the past few weeks about “God Sightings” or “God Winks” - those times that we see the love of God moving in the world. I think it is crucial for Christ's Church to look to God and look for God each and every day - not just in times of emergency or Crisis.

You should be seeing in our pews slips of paper where we can record how we see God active in and around us. We want to know what God is doing - we are asking you to help us ALL see the Hand of God at work in the world. This is done anonymously, we aren't going to ask you to identify yourself or embarrass yourself - just help us to see the amazing things God is doing in our world. These will be posted on our God Sightings board, just outside of Luther Hall. Stop by, take a look and be amazed at the wonderful love of God.




