

THRIVENT – JUNE/JULY 2013

Warm greetings to everyone as the summer temperatures have finally arrived. With summer comes scams of many kinds, we should all be alert and cautious when we are approached by someone or some company we do not know to stay safe. Help your family, neighbors and elderly friends understand and learn how to protect themselves. Keep a look out in your neighborhood and let the police know if you see something that just doesn't seem right.

Credit card theft and identity fraud are also a problem that sometimes increases during the summer. Thrivent offers several tips on their website that can help you worry a little less and keep yourself safer during your travels. Here are a few suggestions:

Pack less: You usually won't need all your favorite jewelry; just a few will do. Never take very expensive or valuable jewelry with you. Larger bags are more difficult to handle and may distract you and make you an easier target for thieves. And don't take every credit card with you—leave most of them at home. Also keep a copy of those card numbers written in a safe place at home. And put the phone numbers to call in a separate place in your luggage so you can call right away if you do have a lost or stolen card. You may want to keep your cards protected in a special protective wallet (RFID) so others can't scan your information in coffee shops, restaurants, crowded malls or airports.

Keep yourself protected while you are out sightseeing. Avoid carrying the very large purse with an open top or having your wallet stick out of your back pocket. Keep your valuables in your sight at all times if you are on the beach. These can be an easy target for the thieves.

Learn your surroundings. Do your homework before you leave and know where the local bank is located nearest to your hotel so you won't be caught driving around in search of an ATM late in the evening if your cash runs low. You can get maps online and check with the local Visitors Bureau or Chamber of Commerce for best and safest areas to stay.

When you get home, check your bank statements and credit card accounts to verify all purchases are your own. Check your credit report to make sure nothing unusual or fishy shows up.

Thrivent members are eligible for identity protection membership. You can learn more from your local representative or on the Thrivent website. They also have a checklist on what to do if you have had your identity stolen and names, phone numbers and websites for the three credit reporting agencies to contact.

ACKNOWLEDGING GOD'S OWNERSHIP

One morning before Sunday school, a mother gave her little boy two quarters. "This one is for God," she said, "and this one is for you." As he walked to Sunday school, the little boy played with his money (as little boys are apt to do) and his money came tumbling out of his pocket, with one quarter landing at his feet and the other one going down the sewer drain. Perplexed over this turn of events, the little boy came to a decision about what he would do. "Sorry, God," he said. "There goes your quarter."

This story probably makes us smile. However, are we still smiling when we face similar choices in our daily lives as the boy just made? For example, when we receive our earnings for the work that we do, we must decide how much we will give to God and how much we will keep for ourselves. The boy didn't think that God deserved his quarter or, at least, that he deserved it more! Do we believe that we should be returning to God a generous portion of the money He has given us? To find out how we answered that question, we can look at our checkbooks. Our checkbooks will tell us what we really love and what is important to us. "Follow the money," as the popular saying goes.

When we cling to earthly wealth, we ask, "What do I have?" When we aspire to serve the Lord, we ask, "What can I give?" As God's children, we don't hoard treasures, but rather we willingly seek ways to share God's blessings with others. As we do so, we are given the assurance that God has given us "moneybags that do not grow old" and a "treasure in the heavens that do not fail" (Luke 12:33)

Jesus says, "Where your treasure is, there your heart will be also" (Matthew 6:21). What is more important to you? Does your treasure lie in the temporary wealth of this world or the eternal inheritance of God? It really is an "either/or" situation. Either we think we are the owners of al. that we have, and, therefore, we owe God nothing, or we acknowledge that everything we are and have comes from His gracious hand. There is no middle way!
