



August 2013

Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Grace to you and peace from God our Father and our Lord Jesus Christ. Amen.

What does it mean to be the Church? When I ask that question to most people I don't get the answer to that question. What I often get an answer to is the question "What did it mean to be the Church?" The response many of us give to the question is a romanticized memory of booming worship attendance, Sunday School classes that are bursting at the seam, and catechism classes with 30 or 40 students. Those nostalgic memories are

wonderful, but they are just that, memories. Many of us recognize the climate for Church in 2013 is not the same as it was in 1960.

The reality we face in 2013 is that our population is shrinking and aging. Not just St. Paul's, not just Defiance County, but all of Northwest Ohio, with the exception of a small pocket between Bowling Green and Findlay we see decline all around us. The landscape for ministry is changing each day.

For many of us the idea of the Ministry by Magnetism is still appealing. The theory being if we have just the right worship style, the perfect program, the meaningful Sunday School, the right Pastor, the hip youth group then people will flock to the Church. If only that were the case. While it seems to have worked in the early 90's when new church starts with dynamic pastors, amazing bands, great technology, and fantastic youth programs were growing, what those congregations are seeing now is that when the pastor leaves, the band leader changes, the youth person gets older... the people move to the largest growing Christian group in the country, the "NONES".

That's the biggest change the Church faces folks. In the good old days if a person got upset with something in one congregation, they moved to another congregation, so while it may have looked like growth it was really just transition. Today, when folks leave a congregation, they are just as likely to become a "NONE" as they are to move to a different dot on the map. The largest growing group of Christians in the U.S. is not Lutheran, Baptist, Episcopal, Roman Catholic, it's a group of people who consider themselves to be "none of the above."

Many leaders in the Church have given up hope. Chicken Little has taken up residence in many places, "The sky is falling, the sky is falling." Let's be honest, we have a few Chicken Little's around here, maybe you've heard them, maybe you've found yourself starting a conversation with the words, "Remember when...", or, "It used to be..." Granted, the climate is different, it may look as if the sky is falling at times, but in the words of Bluto from Animal House, "What? Over? Did you say "over"? Nothing is over until we decide it is! Was it over when the Germans bombed Pearl Harbor? Most certainly not!" While not totally accurate the point is that this is God's Church, the Holy Spirit is still dynamic, active and alive.

In recent weeks Pastor Tom Lyberg and I invited pastors from all over the Synod to join us for Holy Conversation about these topics. We are going to meet regularly to pray, to converse, to share with one another about what it means to be Church in 2013.

So, do you want some good news? After reading through this, I know I do. The good news is that what many of the pastors gathered agreed to is, "relationship works" - or to use a churchy term, "discipleship is key." Programs are hard work, the perfect worship service is fleeting, and the pastor is only as good as their last sermon – but those aren't what matters the most any more. It's about building relationships, friendships, asking people a simple question, "So what is God up to in your life?" Then, we listen. Listen to the hurts and joys, the anger and the happiness, the bad and the good. I've observed that we do that well. Coffee Hour, Work Days, Service Guild, Funeral Teams, we talk well. We do relationship well. We listen to one another, we talk to one another, we invite others into conversation. The sky is NOT falling, we are just on the road and God is with us.




