Gotta get those visitors to close the deal and join up. Too many people think that mission of the Church is to swell the ranks and fill the pews. Too many people think that this task is my job. Too many people find me a failure for not getting this done.

So. No more just "growing the church.

Church Building Sealing Project

As most of you know we have been working on the outside of the church which has been in need of being sealed to help prevent water intrusion damage. The Church Council has agreed to kick-off a fund raising campaign to finance this project. We have estimated that we will need about \$22,000 to do the sealing and complete the entire structure.

In order to do this, we felt it would be best to do this in 2 phases. The first part will be to seal about 20%-30% of the church yet this fall. The second phase will be next summer to complete the remaining portion. Over the next 6 to 8 months we will be asking for your financial gifts/contributions so that we can complete this project to help maintain and preserve the structural integrity of the church for many years to come.

We recently completed the fall portion of the project already and would like to thank all those who contributed to make that possible to get this important and critical phase done before winter sets in. As for the remainder of the contributions, we are hoping to raise the funds between now and into early 2014. We ask that you prayerfully consider a donation for this cause.
