GET TO KNOW OUR NEW PRESIDING BISHOP

+Bishop Elizabeth Eaton

- Native of Cleveland, Ohio
- Bishop of Northeastern Ohio Synod
- +Bp. Eaton is a graduate of Harvard Divinity School and the College of Wooster. Her husband, the Rev. Conrad Selnick, is an Episcopal priest.

Some quotes from recent interviews:

A few quotes of note:

"We say we depend upon God," she said. "Now we are being tested to see if we really believe that. Are we engaged in prayer in this? Do we believe that if it's God's will to raise up a Lutheran witness to the gospel, then it's going to happen?"

"You've heard of people who are spiritual but not religious? I would describe myself as religious but not spiritual," she said. Her goal, she said, is to learn to let go and let God work through her, which is what she believes congregations need to do as well.

"The ELCA is already calling its congregations to be missionaries to their neighborhoods, but that doesn't mean acting as if the church has all the answers"

"We need to go out and meet our neighbors and listen to them about what's going on in their lives. Tell us about the God you believe in or don't believe in."

When her college-age nephew told her that he didn't believe in God, she asked him to describe the God he didn't believe in, she said. After listening to his description of a wrathful, anti-science, anti-intellectual deity, she told him, "'I don't believe in that God either.' We got to the point where I was able to say this is the God I believe in, this is why Jesus makes sense in my life."

A FEW THOUGHTS FROM PASTOR

It has been a while since I have uttered the phrase, "I am excited about the Church." I, like many, have been discouraged for these past few years about being the Church. External criticisms, internal divisions, people leaving, sides being chosen. It's been a difficult few years to get excited about the Church. Mind you, not faith in God – but about what it means to be in the Church.

I am happy to say that these past few weeks I have been excited about where God is leading this outpouring of his Body, about the change that is afoot, about the new Spirit that seems to be moving. In meetings with brother and sister pastors, in conversations with folks spread throughout the ELCA I sense an excitement that I have not felt in years. I have felt walls of uncertainty begin to be taken down, I have felt a renewed zeal for mission and ministry. I am excited about the Church.

+Bp Eaton will begin her duties as Presiding Bishop on 01November. I would ask that you join me on that day and the days following to keep her in your prayers. We never know what our prayers mean to another. A friend of mine tells the story of going through a struggle in ministry. As he was visiting a member who was just coming out of a coma after a car accident the patient asked, "Pastor, how are you and how are things at church?" The pastor was honest with his struggles and that it seemed like the momentum at the congregation has slowed down. The member smiled, reached out and touched his hand and said, "Pastor, thank you and everyone for their prayers for me – but now it's time for me to do the job God has called me to do.

The Pastor was a bit puzzled when the person said, "My call is to pray for you, by name every day. My call is to pray specifically for one area of our ministry every day. Since the accident I haven't been able to do that, but it's time again."

Nothing we do happens without prayer folks. Nothing we do is of our own making. We must be a church, a congregation that is undergirded in prayer. The First Sunday in Advent starts a new liturgical year... may it be a year of prayer for all of us.

Pastor's Report:

- a. Pastor's Sunday School Class is focusing on Current Events and WIGIAT (where is God in all that). Please join in.

- d. Three new trees have been planted near our parking lot by the city. There are three more to come.




