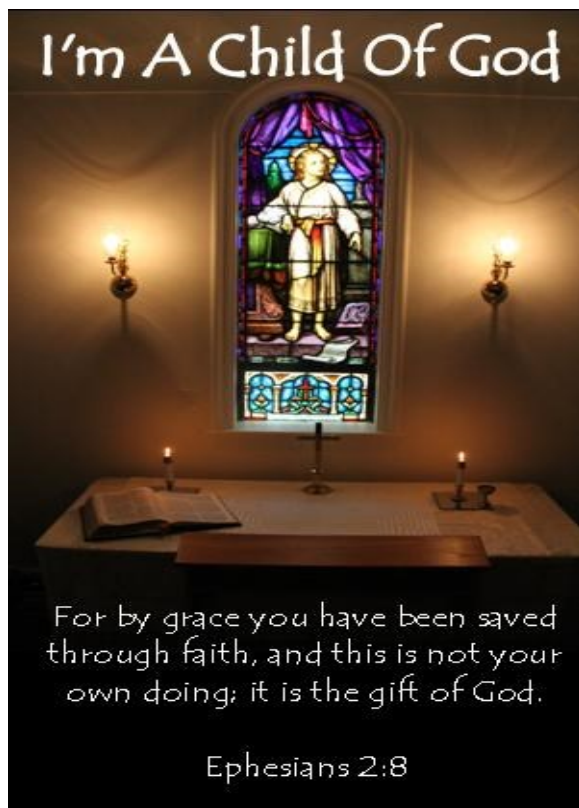

January 16, 2014**

Meeting called to order at 6:15pm. by Jim Martin.

Pr. Dave opened the meeting by sharing a reading: "God will never give you more than you can handle." We need to know we can bring the load to Christ. "Come to me all who are weary and heavy-laden, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me....For my yoke is easy and my burden is light."

- g. Installation of the 2014 Church Council will be Feb. 2.
- h. Pastor was published in a Lenten Sermon Series. He has been asked to teach preaching to a community of lay leaders.

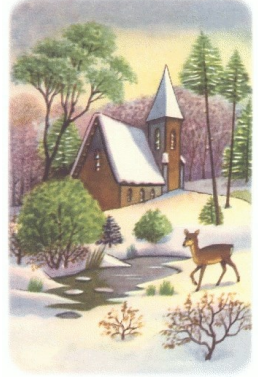

THRIVENT – February 2014



“Winter is upon us in full force. What a cold snowy winter it has been in Ohio. The cold blowing winds and the near zero temperatures fill our days. We snuggle inside our coats and mittens and try to stay at home in warm houses as much as possible. This is our comfort zone and we don’t like to venture out from it.” Those words were written originally for my Thrivent article in 2004. Some things don’t change much—the winters in northwestern Ohio are likely to be cold and snowy. Being home a little more due to very cold days has given me a little more time to think about ‘promises’ or goals I’ve wanted to keep. Reading the Bible and studying God’s word is an ongoing promise I’ve made. *“How precious to me are thy thoughts, O God! How vast is the sum of them!” Psalm 139:17* Is it the fact that the Bible has so many chapters and so much to read that makes me hesitate to pick it up sometimes? Am I not sure where to start?—that is a definite YES at times. But instead of thinking about reading it from cover to cover, I am trying to take just small steps this year. If I read only one chapter a week or even one or two verses, I am likely to still read the Bible more than I did before. And that is a step in the right direction. Taking a step at a time outside the comfort zone and keeping up an even pace, even if it is a slow one, is the way to make progress.

Speaking of steps, our walking team from St. Paul for Relay for Life is already making plans for this year’s fundraising event and needs your help. They are hosting a Pasta Dinner on February 9th following our worship service. This will be a hearty meal that will warm your body. There will be lasagna, spaghetti, salad, garlic bread and several pasta casseroles for you to enjoy. Please join us downstairs for a delicious meal and fellowship to help out. A free will donation will be collected.

As my grandchildren are growing up, they continue to teach me new things. My 4 year old is learning to recognize all his ABC’s and my Kindergartener is learning how to pronounce the sounds for each of them and write them. Recently I came across an ABC list of Bible passages, starting out with “A Awake, awake; put on your strength, O Zion! (Isaiah 52: 1).”

The children study the same letter all week and then go on to the next one. Perhaps this is the one verse that I will learn this week and then continue letter by letter to make progress. You may want to make your own list and follow it week by week. May your days be warm and peaceful and hopefully you too can make progress toward your goals, one step at a time. Thank you for your support of all our Thrivent events.

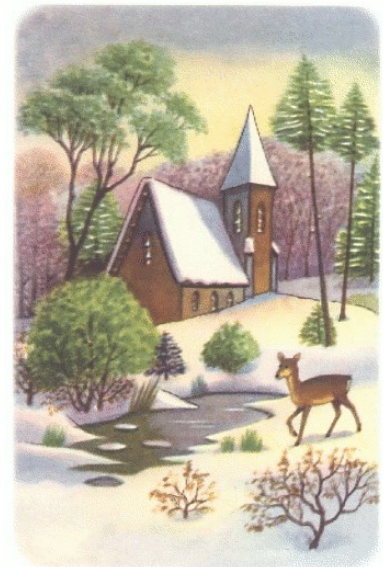

THE HUNGER BANQUET an event to REMEMBER

presented by **Northwestern Ohio Community Action Commission**

- ♦ The Hunger Banquet is an educational dining event designed to expand the understanding of people in the community about the issues related to hunger, food insecurity and poverty in Northwest Ohio.



- ♦ Life is at times difficult to manage. Without warning circumstances can change; sometimes for the positive, but more often they are negative. Diners will experience distinct socio-economic classes throughout the evening. They may find themselves in line at the soup-kitchen, being served a 5-course gourmet meal, or somewhere in between.
