



HEAD START program is currently taking applications for the 2014-2015 school year.

Head Start is a free federal preschool program for children ages 3 –5 years old that promote school readiness for preschool-aged children from low-income families. This program, under the administration of NOCAC, receives Federal and State funding to serve 465 children in 9 centers and 4 home base groups throughout Defiance, Fulton, Henry, Paulding, and Williams Counties.

To qualify for Head Start, families must be below 100% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines, be receiving TANF/OWF Cash Assistance, or receiving Social Security Disability. Families who are homeless and children in foster care are automatically eligible.

Free nutritious meals are offered through the sponsorship of the Child Care Food Program.

Children who attend preschool have greater success in school and throughout their lives. The benefits of preschool include higher reading and math scores, higher graduation rates from both high school and college, and higher employment earnings.
