Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Grace to you and peace from God our Father and our Lord Jesus Christ! Amen.

"Lord, may we see through death the gate to eternal life." It seems I have spoken this prayer too often this summer. Whether it be standing by a bedside, in the lounge before a service begins, at a funeral, in my own prayers as I prepare for a funeral. These are difficult words for us, difficult words to say, and perhaps even more difficult to hear. These words, which speak of new beginnings and hopes also echo to us the realities of doors closings and endings.

Death is a difficult thing, the greatest adventure into the unknown. We know the words from St. Paul, that "nothing can separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord, not even the grave." Those words sound wonderful, until we or a loved one find a deeper reality in them. Death is something we all will face, deaths of acquaintances, deaths of friends, deaths of loved ones, and eventually our own death. It is something that none of us will escape.

I have always wondered how people face death without the sure and certain hope of the resurrection. How a person can face the darkness of the tomb, without faith in the light of new life in Christ. Where does a person turn when all that is facing them is the darkness of eternity. For those of us of faith, we have that assurance and promise of eternal life.

Luther says that Scripture calls us to a life of daily dying and rising to new life in Christ. Daily dying to our sins and receiving the promise of grace, daily dying to our grudges and rising to a life of forgiveness. For those of us of faith, we are faced every day with the death of the old and new birth. Some of our more charismatic Christian brothers and sisters speak about being "born again", Jesus speaks to Nicodemus about being "born anew". There is a call in our Christian life for being born anew, but there is no resurrection without crucifixion, there is no new birth without death of the old.

St. Paul speaks of the death of the Old Adam and the life of the New Adam, or of the perishable putting on the imperishable. What in our lives need to die in order to step into the light of new life? Greed, pride, anger, an old grudge, fear? What is it in YOUR life that needs to experience death so that your soul can experience the new life found in Christ our Lord?

No, brothers and sisters, we can not escape our physical death. Yes, brothers and sisters, like Martha we reply to Jesus challenge, "I am the resurrection and the life. The one who believes in me will live, even though they die; and whoever lives by believing in me will never die. Do you believe this?" YES LORD.

Jesus calls us to new life, not just AFTER the tomb, but every day, every moment Jesus calls us to new life in him. We pray for renewal, for stronger faith, for spiritual joy – but for us to have that new life, there is a part of us that must die.

Gracious Lord, help us to die to ourselves, and be born anew in you. Amen.

MEN IN MISSION—MACKINAC BRIDGE WALK

The Mackinac Bridge walk at the Upper Peninsula of Michigan began in 1958 soon after the bridge, which is the third largest suspension bridge in the world, was built. The length of the bridge is 28 feet short of 5 miles. The Walk is held each year on Labor Day and begins at 7:00 am starting at the northern end of the bridge with the Governor in the lead.


Lutheran Men in Mission began the walk in 2009 from an idea of Bob Coffman of Men in Mission. It is used to sponsor Luther Home of Mercy in Williston and Filling Home in Napoleon both of which you are probably familiar with for their great humanitarian work. Getting walkers who then generate sponsors for their walking does this. Last year over \$7,000 was generated by the walk, which was split equally between the two homes. This year we have a goal of \$10,000.

Even though Lutheran Men in Mission organize the Walk many others walk including both men and women. We usually have around 18 walkers each year. Some people come early and stay late. Since its beginning a gracious friend of one of our members, who goes by the name of Buck, lets many of us stay in his cabin for only \$20 per night. The cabin, which is actually a small but very nice house, is located about 70 miles northwest of the bridge. It is nice to go up on a Friday or Saturday and then take in the wonderful sites, scenery and the cool temperatures.

On Sunday Men in Mission usually goes to church at Zion Lutheran Church, which is just on the north side of the bridge. On Monday morning they sometimes arrange to have a wonderful breakfast, supplied by the ladies of the Church, before they begin their walk at 10:00 am. The Walk usually takes around 2 1/2 hours. You can begin as late as 11:00 am and walk at your own pace. Half of the bridge is closed to traffic and the other half is open to north and south-bound traffic. No bicycles or motorized vehicles, except motorized wheel chairs, can be used on the Walk. People with walkers have been observed on the bridge. The secretary of Men in Mission, Dick Noll, has for the last 4 years arm powered his way across the bridge with no pushing assistance and without stopping. The hardest part is the first 2 1/2 miles, which is up hill. The weather has been great and the scenery while crossing is wonderful.

It is a great experience for any one who wants to escape the heat of the summer and at the same time help out Luther Home of Mercy and Filling Home. 
