

Not only were there zero rounds of golf, there were also very few actual days off since returning from vacation.

Do you see it? BUSY. Too busy to be effective at almost anything. Never really still, never really at peace, just constantly on the go DOING what needed to be done. Now, don't get me wrong, doing what needs to be done is a good thing – but not at the expense of BEING that child of God.

The Bible warns us, begs us, pleads with us to rest, to not be so busy doing. "On the 7th day, God rested." "Remember the Sabbath day and keep it Holy." "Be still and know that I am God." "In the morning, while it was still very dark, Jesus got up and went out to a deserted place, and there he prayed."

There is something about having time to be idle. We were not created to be on the go constantly, we were not created to be under constant stress, we are not healthy when we don't have time to just BE.

Luther once said, "I have so much to do, I shall spend the first three hours in prayer." I think perhaps Jesus, the Bible, and Luther were onto something, something critical for life. So, how about you, what are you going to do to just "BE".

Meeting called to order at 6:00pm. by Jason Frederick.

Pr. Dave opened the meeting in prayer. Be a people of prayer. Don't put it off. Pray the first thing in the morning and the last thing at night. Be sure to include the Commandments and the Lord's Prayer.

1. Pastor's Report:

- a. VBS '14 was an amazing year! The addition of the adult class was a huge success. The adult class had new members stopping in every evening. Looking forward to next year.
- b. Rally Day! Sunday, September 7th is Rally Day. The chicken floppers and Sunday School staff are fired up and ready to go. Sunday School begins at 9:00am and Worship at 10:15am.
- c. Thank You to Service Guild for donations from their treasury. \$575.00 for work on the back stairway, and \$3000.00 to cover the completion of the sealing of the church stone.
- d. September 14th Pastor will be with Conor for Parent's Weekend.
- e. October 5: Mission Festival Dinner
- f. October 16: Conference Gathering with the Bishop
- g. October 26: Reformation Sunday
- h. November 26: Thanksgiving Eve Service planning has begun.

2. Youth and Family Report:

- a. Junior Luther League and Disciples in Radical Training (DIRT): Stacy Barker will lead JLL this year and will welcome younger youth starting in 2nd grade. DIRT is a Wednesday night youth group for our older youth. Confirmation youth meet the 1st and 3rd week. DIRT meets each week and includes youth grades 6-12.
- b. Mission: Defiance Community VBS was held July 7-11 at Defiance College with St. Paul United Methodist, First Presbyterian and Zion Lutheran participating. This year a total of 257 youth participated. Thank you to the 70 volunteers and those who chose a leadership role. We are thrilled to report that we came in \$800 under budget!
- c. Parish Education: There are many ideas to make Sunday School more inviting.
 - 1) There will be a Pre-K class (birth to age 3), a K-1 class, a 2nd-4th class and Theresa Hiler will be taking the 5-8th class emphasizing Bible Study and community service.
 - 2) Continue the Wednesday Bible School events throughout the year.
 - 3) Bring back singing and youth/Sunday School choir if there is interest.
- d. Youth: This fall the churches will again combine to host Slime Time. We are planning to host this event at St Paul on November 1st this year.

- d. The redbud tree is now down. Also trees were trimmed over the rental house, the handicapped ramp, and the birch tree area. Private donations covered the cost of this work.
- e. The remaining church stone seal work was completed on the north and east side of the sanctuary the week of August 4th.
- f. Todd is looking into quotes on replacing the brick work on the east basement door to stop the water leaks.
- g. Thank you to Service Guild for their donations to help complete the stone seal and the brick work! You are the best!!!

8. Old Business:

- a. Jim Martin and Bill Parker met with the company rep on the new church sanctuary sound system. The shotgun mics won't work in our building so we are getting a \$198 credit for each; Also looking into another mic for Pastor. They are waiting on a quote for needed work on this system.

MEN IN MISSION—MACKINAC BRIDGE WALK Monday, September 1, 2014

The Mackinac Bridge walk at the Upper Peninsula of Michigan began in 1958 soon after the bridge, which is the third largest suspension bridge in the world, was built. The length of the bridge is 28 feet short of 5 miles. The Walk is held each year on Labor Day and begins at 7:00 am starting at the northern end of the bridge with the Governor in the lead.


Lutheran Men in Mission began the walk in 2009 from an idea of Bob Coffman of Men in Mission. It is used to sponsor Luther Home of Mercy in Williston and Filling Home in Napoleon both of which you are probably familiar with for their great humanitarian work. Getting walkers who then generate sponsors for their walking does this. Last year over \$7,000 was generated by the walk, which was split equally between the two homes. This year we have a goal of \$10,000.

Even though Lutheran Men in Mission organize the Walk many others walk including both men and women. We usually have around 18 walkers each year. Some people come early and stay late. Since its beginning a gracious friend of one of our members, who goes by the name of Buck, lets many of us stay in his cabin for only \$20 per night. The cabin, which is actually a small but very nice house, is located about 70 miles northwest of the bridge. It is nice to go up on a Friday or Saturday and then take in the wonderful sites, scenery and the cool temperatures.

On Sunday Men in Mission usually goes to church at Zion Lutheran Church, which is just on the north side of the bridge. On Monday morning they sometimes arrange to have a wonderful breakfast, supplied by the ladies of the Church, before they begin their walk at 10:00 am. The Walk usually takes around 2 1/2 hours. You can begin as late as 11:00 am and walk at your own pace. Half of the bridge is closed to traffic and the other half is open to north and southbound traffic. No bicycles or motorized vehicles, except motorized wheel chairs, can be used on the Walk. People with walkers have been observed on the bridge. The secretary of Men in Mission, Dick Noll, has for the last 4 years arm powered his way across the bridge with no pushing assistance and without stopping. The hardest part is the first 2 1/2 miles, which is up hill. The weather has been great and the scenery while crossing is wonderful.

It is a great experience for any one who wants to escape the heat of the summer and at the same time help out Luther Home of Mercy and Filling Home. If anyone would like to walk or sponsor Dick Noll, another person you know is walking, or someone else from your congregation, there is a form on the backside of this page.







A message from Ravens Care, Inc.

We would like to take a moment to alert you to a situation that is developing in our community. The city of Defiance passed new guidelines in regard to their operation of the water and sewer service that was effective immediately. All **past due** water customers will receive a 10 day shut off notice and their water will be shut off on that date. To reconnect a customer will have to pay the outstanding balance and a \$75 dollar reconnect fee and add \$125.00 to their existing deposit of \$75.00 to adhere to the new \$200.00 water deposit requirement. The Water Department has agreed to waive the reconnect fee if an agency such as ourselves (RAVENS Care) is helping a client.

The Water Department has allowed customers for a long time, to pay the past due amount and keep their water turned on. There are a large number of folks who have been making monthly payments but are still 1 month behind and are being sent these notices. Some of them paid at the beginning of the month and were told that would be sufficient to keep service on and now that is no longer true. RAVENS Care has been seeing at least 8 families a day in addition to our normal case load for water shutoffs and the schedule is full through Wednesday. We are trying to sort out the truly emergency cases. Those that are sick or elderly or have young babies or are pregnant and can't handle the extra work required to carry water from their neighbors. We will not help those who simply have not paid their bill or have a budget that looks like they won't be able to afford the water if they do get it turned back on. We are helping as many as we can and asking each person how much they can contribute to this expense. Hopefully this crisis will be a springboard to invite more folks to our budget planning classes.

We are instructing people that they can use their toilets by pouring water from a bucket into the back of their toilets and that they can get this water and hopefully some drinking water as well from neighbors and transport it in buckets or plastic containers for drinking water. There is also bottled water available at our office effective Monday A.M. Also, we will have 5 gallon buckets for transporting waste water. We are helping as many as we can and asking each person how much they can contribute to the expense.

Please encourage your members to be neighborly, look out and help those that are in temporary crisis by sharing water, offering to do a load of laundry or even showering.

Please pray for the families that are being impacted. And feel free to share your thoughts on what else we can do.
