Exhausted, not handling stress well, impatient, anxious, frustrated, weary? Sound familiar to any of us? I know it does to me. In the past month the number one phrase that has come from my lips is, "I'm exhausted", in a way that sleep does not help. I am emotionally and spiritually tired, my stress level is too high, my laughter too infrequent.

This has got me thinking about the ways in which stress affects our attitudes, our decisions, and our relationships. Stress tests in the medical field are intended to see how the body will respond to being pushed. Similarly, in the realm of our Christian walk with the Lord, life-situation stress tests are being administered all the time.

In truth, everybody in the church is going through stressful circumstances of a number of varieties. The question is not if stress is present, but how intense and unrelenting is that stress. Stress in job situations, economic and financial stress, stress about war and terrorism, medical stress, anxiety about life and death, relationship stress. Stress is abundant my friends, in all of our lives.

The question for us in the Church is this: How does our faith in Jesus Christ inform and guide how we respond to these varying degrees of stress? How do we treat others in the midst of these times of stress? In biology we hear of the "reptilian" response. How do we respond when we don't have the energy to think about what we are doing or saying? How does Christ shape our response?

If we're honest with ourselves, we must admit that we don't always handle stress as well as we should. More troubling, is that on the negative side of these results we often allow stressful circumstances to explain our behavior. Have you gotten short or snappy with someone, let your anger boil over, been hurtful to another – and chalked it up to a bad day, a bad week, a bad month? Have you been tempted to run others down, criticizing them in a subconscious hope that this will make us feel better.

Sometimes getting away is necessary, though rarely is it a cure all. However, for many of you, the stress you are dealing with will be present for months if not years. So, the question for us as people of faith is, "Where is God in the midst of this?" Yes, you have heard the phrase before "WIGIAT", where is God in our stress filled lives?

Trust me, God is present, calling us from stress into his rest. But this can only happen when we respond to His call through prayer and study. Prayer is needed so that God will open our eyes to ourselves, to a real knowledge of not only our strengths but our realities. Bible study is needed so that God will open our eyes to Him, a real knowledge of who God is and the help that He intends to offer those who come to Him.

When Jesus said, "Come to me all you who are weary and heavy-burdened – I will give you rest," He calls us to the cross, He calls us to the empty tomb, He calls us to times of quiet and reflection, He calls us to receive His Body and Blood, He calls us to prayer and His Word.

Come, rest, be renewed.

For 11 years St. Paul has provided a meal 3 times per year to the Path Center which serves the homeless. Terry Seimet has faithfully cooked this meal.



Fall is a time for change—the change of the seasons, our time change, the change to daily routines for the school and sports programs and change of schedule for worship and our Sunday school classes again.



And I want to let you know about the changes coming for Thrivent. In 2003 we changed from two organizations—AAL and Lutheran Brotherhood—to become one together as Thrivent for Lutherans. They provided funding support for each Lutheran congregation as well as for a Community Chapter and its sponsored events. Changes came again in 2010 when the Choice Dollars charitable grant program was introduced. They no longer sent a specific amount of grant funds to each congregation directly but let the individual members choose to support the organization or congregation that they selected from a list of thousands of qualified non-profit organizations nationwide, Lutheran and non-Lutheran, that included their own congregations. The amount of Choice dollars for each member is based on their own insurance premiums, contract values and your volunteer leadership. More change came in early 2014 with a name change and Thrivent became available to all Christians, not just Lutherans. Thrivent members will be a larger part of our communities.

Change is happening now with the Care Abounds in Communities program. We will continue to have our local chapter in 2015 but it will perhaps receive less funding. Thrivent wants to move away from being a "granting organization" and become a "member driven action organization". It starts with your idea for a one time fundraiser, service activity or even an education event that can be completed within 90 days. You must apply for funds and have your project approved. Next outline what you plan to do and how you want to get it done. Once approved, you will receive some Thrivent print materials for promotion and advertising for your event. You can also receive project funding up to \$250 for other supplies needed. Select your date. Find others to help you with your project. Then you can take action to accomplish your idea. When you are done, thank your volunteers and sponsors and be sure to share your story. If you are interested, there is more information available on the Thrivent website—www.thrivent.com. If you have an idea, know someone in need or a service project you have thought about doing, let me know and I can help you get started.

Our mission Festival is this month and we are looking forward to a delicious meal. Chris Korhn is heading up our team. If you would like to help, give her a call. Thrivent will be giving up to \$600 additional funding for our Food Banks in Defiance. Join us for a great time, good food, and help support our mission recipients.
