Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Grace to you and peace from God our Father and our Lord Jesus Christ. Amen.

I sit to write this just before we celebrate The Reformation. That time when Martin Luther, seeking to reform the Church Catholic posted his 95 Theses on the Castle Church Doors at Wittenberg. Luther called for reform, for dialog, for debate, for change. Luther called for The Church to take a long hard look at herself, at Scripture, at Theology, and at what it meant to be The Church. Make no mistake, there was and is still serious need for reform in Christ's Church.

Unfortunately, what began as a movement at reform ended as a schism and division. Sadder still, those divisions still haunt us 500 years later. We are, and I include myself, quick to point the finger at what we see as errors in others theology, orthodoxy, and their practice. Y'all know how quick I am to point that finger at others - it is something I daily ask God to forgive me and to stop my tongue and direct my actions.

Recently, on October 13th to be exact, just a couple of weeks before Reformation Day, Pope Francis was addressing a crowd of Christian pilgrims during a General Audience at The Vatican. His address touched on many themes, but one of them stood out to me that I'd like to share with you.

Pope Francis stated, "There are many people here, sharing our faith in Christ, belonging to other faith confessions or traditions. Before this situation, that throughout history has often been a cause of conflict and suffering, what is our attitude? Do we resign ourselves? Are we indifferent? Or do we believe that it's possible to walk towards reconciliation and full communion?"

Following the "wounds" of separation, the Pope continued, "there always appear pride and selfishness that make us intolerant and incapable of listening and accepting whoever has a different point."

The Holy Father then stressed that we are called to pray for the "unity of Christians."

"The Lord asks us not to close ourselves to dialogue and encounter," he said, "but that we be open to all that which is valuable and positive in those who don't think and act like us."

Pope Francis said that we ought to "accentuate that which unites us: Jesus and the richness of his love."

"From him we learn to forgive, to feel like a part of the same family, to consider ourselves as a gift for others and to carry out many good things together, many works of charity for the common good."

Pope Francis concluded by inviting everyone "to pray to the Lord so that we truly become one family."

We have an opportunity to pray FOR one another and to pray WITH one another in this community. Thanksgiving Eve, Good Friday, Gentle Worship just to name a few. In this time of reformation my prayer is that I be a man of reconciliation - still knowing that Christ is always calling His bride, The Church, to reform. Would you join me?




