Again, I will be inviting folks to bring notebooks and Bibles as these will be times of study and teaching during our Holden Evening Prayer Time.

I'm excited about where God is calling us in the years to come. Together, we have shared an amazing journey together, tears and laughter, life and death, joy and sorrow, Baptisms, Weddings, and Funerals. The joy is that we are just getting started.

Women's Retreat 2015 Information

O: What is it?

A: A Recharge weekend is a chance for you to get away to focus on yourself and God. A chance to pause. Breathe. Pray. Time to open yourself up to your relationship with God and connect with a group of women who love Him, too. It is a place where surprising things will happen as we gather to see what God is up in our lives.

Quotes from those who have attended:

"I wasn't sure I even wanted to go my first time. I felt happy in my relationship with God. But I never imagined how much better it could be. Nor how much it would mean to meet Christian friends."

I went after hearing about it from a friend. I wasn't sure I would even stay. Honestly, I can't begin to tell you how welcome I felt from the moment I got there. I don't know when I have smiled so much. And I re-connected with God. It has changed my faith life to feel Him near."

Q: Do I have to talk?

A: No. Really. No. We do not pressure you to participate. We welcome sharing. We never require it.

O: So what do we do there?

A: It is unlike any other retreat you've attended. Team members have prepared to tell you stories from our lives about how God works throughout the Christian life. Come see how God is powerfully active in each of us. We also spend time in personal prayer, community prayer, and in fellowship and fun. We come together to Recharge our faith life.

Q: We spend the night?

A: The Recharge team recommends you come prepared to spend the night. It is not required but often we have found people who did not plan to stay really wish they had. We have comfortable air mattresses for you. Just bring some bedding/sleeping bag and your pillow. IF you want to return to your own bed, however, that is not a problem. Please try to stay to the end on Saturday night, and return first thing Sunday morning. Otherwise you will miss a great deal. Also, may we suggest? Pack a bag and leave it in the car in case you change your mind. You wouldn't be the first.

Q: What about food?

A: Delicious food is provided for you. If you have any special needs or allergies, please let us know and we will attempt to accommodate them.

Q: How much is this going to cost?

A: There is an anonymous free will donation at the end of the weekend. Do not let cost be a barrier.

Q: How do I sign up?

The Recharge Team knows it can be hard to commit to your first retreat. We were uncomfortable too. But we'd encourage you to come give it a try. It is $1\frac{1}{2}$ winter days that may lead you to a closer walk with the Jesus who loves you dearly. Come find out what is in store for you.



THRIVENT – February 2015

"To give unto them beauty for ashes; the oil of joy for mourning."

---Isaiah 61:3

Ash Wednesday, February 18, starts our Lenten season again. On this day we will receive the ashes on our foreheads with the mark of the cross and remember the words from Genesis that we hear each year. This has been done traditionally in the Christian churches since the Middle Ages and perhaps from as early as the 8th Century. We know we are sinners and need

- 1. At one time February was the last month of the year. True or false?

 Originally the Roman calendar was only ten months. Two months were added at the end of the year, but later changed to become the first two months so that made February the last month.

 This led to the inconsistency of the ninth to twelfth months actually getting their names from the numbers seven to ten.
- 2. February gets its name from the word februa. What language does this word come from? Latin
- **3.** What is the meaning of the word "februa"? It means purification. The Romans held feast of purification during this month.
- **4.** Augustus Caesar took a day from February to make August the same length as July. True or false?

There is a legend that he wanted the month named after him to be the same length as the month named after Julius Caesar, but there is no evidence to indicate that this is true.

5. What flower do many people consider February's flower?

The correct answer was primrose

- **6.** What is the birthstone for February? Amethyst for sincerity.
- **7.** How often does February have twenty-nine days? Every four years

 There is actually a rare exception to this rule. When the year ends with 00, the first two digits have to be divisible by 4 to be a leap year
- 8. Was 1900 a leap year? Yes or No?

Although 1900 is divisible by four, it was not a leap year. In years ending with 00, the first two digits standing alone have to be divisible by four. Thus 1600 and 2000 were leap years, 1700, 1800 and 1900 were not.

- 9. The second of February is Groundhog Day. It is also a special day for Roman Catholics. What is it? Candlemas Day (the festival of lights) Candlemas is a traditional Christian festival that commemorates the ritual purification of Mary forty days after the birth of her son Jesus.
- 10. What is the correct way to pronounce the name of this month—Feb- roo- error e or Feb- you- er e or Fe- brew- air- e? All of the above depending on your age and the area where you live.
