



Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Grace be unto you and peace from God our Father and our Lord Jesus Christ, Amen!

There is a buzz in the air about the Tent Revival coming this summer. What is it? What will it look like? Is it Lutheran? Will there be snake handling and altar calls like we see in the movies? How can I be involved?

With all of the questions, I thought I would do a FAQ this month.

What is it? What will it look like?

Simply, it will be evening worship outside. A revival is a call for Pentecost in the modern church. A pleading for the movement of the Holy Spirit, while at the same time giving thanks for the gifts of the Spirit that we have seen. It will be a free flowing worship, Gospel hymns, readings of Scripture, preaching, special music, a healing service on Friday night, great food on Saturday night. It is a chance for us to worship AS a community IN the community. So often we worship behind closed doors – this is a chance for us to worship, pray, sing praise, pray, hear God's word, pray as the community gathers with us. Some in the community will hopefully join us, some will drive by, or jog by, or ride their bikes by – and when they do, we will pray that God's Holy Spirit is active in their lives as well.

Is it Lutheran?

That's a very good question. Technically, revivals are usually held by our more "charismatic" brothers and sisters. However, I guarantee you that the worship, the theology, the preaching, and the movement of the service will be Lutheran to it's very core. I can not separate my love of God, The Gospel, and worship from my Lutheran identity that we are saved by grace apart from works of the Law. There will not be altar calls and "televangelist" style healing prayers.

In 1999 the ELCA and the LCMS worked together to create a little used hymnal called, "This Far by Faith" it was designed to be a resource for worship. In the middle of the settings for Holy Communion there is a worship setting called "Service of Prayer and Preaching – REVIVAL". That worship service will provide the framework for what we are doing. On Friday night we will offer a healing service – again the framework for that service will be distinctly Lutheran – modeled on the Liturgy for Word and Healing found in the new ELCA hymnal "Evangelical Lutheran Worship."

Let me assure you, we will not be abandoning our Lutheran tradition for this event – we may see some parts of our Lutheran identity that are a bit less familiar to us, but our worship will be Lutheran to its very core. As I draft the services I am will make sure I am being faithful by having colleagues and Seminary Professors double check the theology that undergirds what we are doing.

Will it look like the movies?

No, no snakes, no arsenic. There may be a few "Amens" etc, the music will be a played with a bit of left hand boogie in it but we ARE Lutheran so I am doubting we see much dancing in the aisles. In truth, it is my prayer that the Holy Spirit does an amazing thing – so that at the end of Saturday we are amazed at what it looks like.

How can I be involved?

Pray; talk to Julie Sasseen, Nancy Nagel, or myself; come to one of the gathering meetings for the support teams; pray; volunteer; pray; invite a friend or a neighborhood; pray; show up at the fundraisers; pray! This event must be surrounded by prayer and coordinated by praying people

Pastor Dave opened the meeting in prayer.

1. Pastor's Report:

- a. For devotions, The Sacrament: Allows us to let go of old anxious woundedness and Become new in Christ's words. We come together as wounded souls.
- b. The month has been filled with Catechism, Conference, Baptisms and Funerals.
- c. April 27, 2015, Tent revival meeting at 6:00 with pizza.
- d. April 28, Community Discussion: "What Do I Say When", led by Pastor Dave here at St. Paul at 7:00pm.
- e. May 10, we welcome Serbian Pastor Jaroslav Javornik to our pulpit to preach.
- f. May 15-16 Synod Assembly. Pastor Dave and Delegates Alex and Collette Knight will attend.
- g. May 24 will be Confirmation Sunday.
- h. May 31 Summer Worship schedule begins. 9:30 am.
- i. Wednesday June 3, Holden Evening Service begins at 7:00pm.
- j. Fall 2015. A ' Lutheran/Catholic Dialogue' discussion group is being organized.

2. Youth and Family Report:

a. JLL and Disciples in Radical Training:

- 1) The youth worked Lenten Soup Suppers, made the Easter breakfast, participated in 'Clean Up Your Parks Day' (4/11), packed backpacks for the Backpack Buddy Program on April 16th and picked up litter around St. Paul.
- 2) We held worship together during Lent. Our youth are receiving <u>The Message Bible</u> from St. Paul to assist them in Bible reading which has gained enthusiasm.
- 3) The Drug Speaking engagement will be postponed until fall.

b. Mission:

- 1) Recharge! The Recharge team has formed and Kayly Brobston is Spiritual Director and Stacy Barker is Lay Director. The team now has 20 members. Next year's weekend takes place Feb.6 and 7th 2016.
- 2) Defiance Community VBS: The planning for DCVBS began in March and continues. We still need more volunteers. Our next meeting will be May 12th at SPUMC. Defiance College has declined our proposal to reduce the rental fee for next year's week long event. All four churches are returning this year with the addition of St. John United Church of Christ.
- 3) The Tent Revival-July 23, 24 &25th: The Potato Bar and Shopathon Fundraisers have been held and the TACO BAR is scheduled for May 3rd. The Tent Revival Offering will go to restoring the St. Paul stained glass windows. A planning meeting will be held Monday April 27th at 6:00pm. Please come and volunteer to help. Thank you to all who have helped make these fund raisers a success.
- 4) Women's Bible Study: A Bible study on Philippians began March 12th. We have a group of about 15 members who meet the 2nd and 4th Thursday of the month. This was an outgrowth of the Recharge Retreat, where women wanted a continuing connection to Christ and each other.

- c. Parish Education and Youth:
 - 1) Sunday School: Two big events were completed in March. The ExcelLENT Adventure (and congregational potluck) and the Journey to Easter. The goal was to promote deeper understanding of Lent and the Holy Week. The movie-'Son of God' was offered to the church and Sunday School on March 15th. Planning of next year's Rally Day and Sun day School events began in April and themes have been selected.
 - 2) Youth Gathering: We have 3-4 youth who plan to attend this summer.


