Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Grace to you and peace from God our Father and our Lord Jesus Christ. Amen.

A few months ago I was asked to speak to a local cancer support group. When I asked what the topic was I was a bit surprised when the leader said, "I think we need to talk about death, and having heard you at a couple of funerals I think you can approach it in a way that isn't maudlin and melancholy."

I wrestled with the task. It's one thing to talk about death and dying at a funeral, quite another to speak about it to a group of cancer survivors, those in the midst of treatment, and even some very recently diagnosed. Actually, after praying and thinking and reflecting on my years in ministry I worked out what I was going to say. My presentation was very simple and straight forward, actually it could be summed up in one word, "LIVE."

You see, one of the things I have learned in my years of ministry, the hundreds of funerals, the thousands of visits to hospitals and nursing homes, the multitude of last rites, the numerous times of prayers at a bedside when someone takes their final breath is this: Death happens to all of us. Whether it be the little infant that died during birth that the young couple wanted me to rock and bless – to the 22 year old young man that took his own life on Easter Sunday - to the firefighter that dies in service to others at 39 – to the dear Saints of the Church who invited me to share their final journey.

I truly believe that the biggest change I have seen in the world in my 20+ years of ministry is that our lives have become so full, that we have become so busy DOING things that we let the moments of BEING slip through our fingers. When I look in the mirror, when I look in others eyes the number one thing I see is tired, fatigue, exhaustion.

This is the season of Easter, during these few weeks we will be reminded that Christ has Risen. Still, during this season of Resurrection I will speak the words of the funeral, "May we see through death the gate to eternal life." Now, don't get me wrong, eternal life is an amazing gift given to us through the amazing grace of our Heavenly Father. However, I believe when we were first formed in our mother's womb, when we were welcomed into God's kingdom through the waters of Baptism we were given more than just a key to eternal life, we were given freedom to truly live.

Will you join me these next few weeks of Easter and be mindful of living. Pause and take in the majestic beauty of Spring as the earth comes back to life. Take a moment every couple of hours to take a deep breath and speak a soft prayer of thanks to God. Be present with one another, be present in the moment and don't let that to do list rob you of the present moment. In short, as I said to the support group I was asked to speak to, "LIVE – because whether you are a Stage 4 Cancer patient, or happen to be in the wrong place when someone runs a red light, or not close to EMS when that artery decides to close off all the way none of us are promised tomorrow. Don't be so consumed by doing that you forget how to BE."

- c. Remember, Free Prayer at Biggby Coffee on Thursday!





VISIT TO SERBIA

This past February Cathy and I were able to accompany Bishop Lohrmann (and his wife Heidi) as he bid farewell to our Lutheran companion synod in Vojvodina, Serbia. It is an honor, indeed, to be able to represent our Church and to be asked to accompany our Bishop in this journey. We are thankful for your thoughts and prayers during this time.

The Northwestern Ohio Synod has enjoyed a companion relationship with the Slovak Lutheran Church in Serbia for 10 years. To us, it seemed like it was just the other day that we signed the Covenant linking our two synods. Throughout his nearly 18 years as our Bishop, Marcus has been very supportive, and in fact instrumental, in encouraging us in Northwestern Ohio to walk together in accompaniment with our Lutheran brothers and sisters in Serbia. In these 10 years of exchanges of persons and spiritual retreats we have discovered that while many miles and cultures separate us ---we have much in common; especially in terms of our common Lutheran faith.

Our journey started with a brief visit to Istanbul (Constantinople) where we visited the Hagia Sophia Cathedral and the Sultan Ahmet (Blue) mosque. It is truly amazing to visit these massive and ornate buildings that were erected in the 1400's! The frescos and other murals and mosaics are some of the most majestic and stunning sights. Istanbul separates two continents---Asia and Europe---as you cross the bridge over the Bosporus Strait, you can literally stand in both continents---at the same time.

We then traveled to Belgrade where we were picked-up by Evka's brother, Janko, who was our driver throughout our visit. We met with Pr. Anna of the Belgrade congregation and had about 4 hours of great conversation, discussing plans for a women's retreat in 2017. When Bishop Lohrmann and his wife Heidi arrived, we all traveled to Novi Sad. We spent a day seeing the city and experiencing the variety of religions that are part of this city—Catholic, Orthodox and Slovak Lutheran in the same neighborhood. Our time spent with Bishop Vrbovsky was informative and enjoyable, looking back at our years of this companionship and talking about the retirement plans ahead, and contemplating the exciting things to come in our future together. We toured the city Museums, ate at the restaurants frequented by local citizenry, and enjoyed the old and new parts of the city. We spent another day in Belgrade with Pr. Jaroslav Javornik and his wife, taking in spectacular sights from the mountain top to the historic fort at the confluence of two rivers. We also toured the largest Eastern Orthodox Church in Europe—which is under-going renovations. On Sunday we were able to visit and worship with our friend Pr. Jasmina Kotas-Medved and her husband, and were treated to a buffet luncheon with her congregation. Even though we'll elect a new bishop in a couple months, our friendships will continue to make this companionship a warm and wonderful experience for many more years.
