Grace be unto you and peace from God our Father and our Lord Jesus Christ, Amen.

During Jesus Farewell Discourse, recorded in the 17th Chapter of John's Gospel Jesus prays for his followers, "I ask not only on behalf of these, but also on behalf of those who will believe in me through their word, that they may all be one. As you, Father, are in me and I am in you, may they also be in us, so that the world may believe that you have sent me. The glory that you have given me I have given them, so that they may be one, as we are one, I in them and you in me, that they may become completely one, so that the world may know that you have sent me and have loved them even as you have loved me."

Within a few years of this prayer Christ's Bride, The Church began to have division. The struggles between Peter and Paul, Jewish believers and Gentile converts, those who demanded circumcision and those who saw circumcision as a matter of the heart. As the Church grew that divisions grew between East and West, then the Reformation, then all of the other smaller reformations. Schisms and divisions have been the way of life for Christ's Church for 2000 years.

Today, in the world there are over 33,000 different religious denominations. In Defiance alone there are over 20 Denominations – and 60 Congregations. It's not hard to see that Jesus prayer for unity has not been carried out all that well by The Body of Christ on Earth.

I feel that part of my Call as a Priest and Pastor is to be a bridge that promotes Christian Unity. To be an initiator and one who invites fellow pilgrims to journey together as much as we are able. Thanksgiving Eve, Gentle Worship, Good Friday are truly highlights of the year for me. One of those other opportunities is coming up very soon. The National Day of Prayer will be celebrated on 05 MAY.

This year, the committee that has organized it is doing something a little different, hoping to allow more people to come together. The Day of Prayer Luncheon this year is at the Eagles. Doors will open at 11:30am with the program starting at Noon.

I have been asked to pray from 12:40-12:44 (hopefully I can keep it to 4 minutes), my task is to pray for our police, fire, military and others who run towards crisis. It is my prayer that as many of you as possible would be able to attend, and if you can't attend, during your lunch time on May 5th, join with us in prayer from where ever you are.

Satan despises Christian prayer, trembles at Christian unity, shakes at the very idea that God's Children can put aside our differences to unite in prayer. Some have asked what they can do to help celebrate my 50th Birthday. For me, there would be no greater gift than us joining together to make Satan tremble. Amen!

Our youth are asking already to go again next year. It was an extremely positive experience and we are deeply grateful for the congregational support
- d. **Women's Bible Study** started the book "Overcoming Fear" with a total of 17 members on April 14th. We will be meeting the 2nd and 4th Thursday here at St. Paul
- e. New Ministry "Carrying On" met 4/18.
- f. **Recharge** met for Discernment on 4/17 to prayerfully listen to God's call to what specific ministry each individual would undertake for the coming year. Our **Spiritual Director** for the coming year is **Stacy Barker** and the **Lay Director** is **Kerry Tuttle**. Please keep our leaders and team in your prayers this year. The **Continuation Committee** led by **Kayly Brobston** will be meeting throughout the year to offer the retreat team assistance and prayer support. Together, all of us will put on the women's retreat next year. Please keep all of them/us in your prayers.
- g. **Deacon's Report** a huge thank you offered to all those who took care and time to make sure worship, Especially during Holy Week, was smooth and sacred. Your behind the scenes dedication to worship is deeply appreciated. God's blessings on you all as you continue in this ministry. **There are still a few months open for lectors this year.**



Congratulations to our confirmands! May your faith continue to grow and thrive!


