

rom The Lastor's Len Grace to you and peace from God our Father and our Lord Jesus Christ. Amen.

There have been times when I have sat to compose a newsletter article that the words have just come together, then times like today where I've got nothing. Over the years I have been taught that at times like this you stop, take a deep breath, and get back to the basics. In the Fire Service and Military we called this a Stand Down! That's what we are going to do this month, a stand down. A chance to remember who we are, what we are about, and most importantly whose we are.

One of my favorite sections of Scripture is the Angel's message to the Ephesian Church in the 2nd Chapter of Revelation. "I know your works, your toil and your patient endurance. I know that you cannot tolerate evildoers; you have tested those who claim to be apostles but are not, and have found them to be false. I also know that you are enduring patiently and bearing up for the sake of my name, and that you have not grown weary. But I have this against you, that you have abandoned the love you had at first."

Sometimes I wonder if we as Christians and The Church lose our first love as we carry out the tasks that need to be done. 23 years ago when +Bishop Alex Black laid hands on my head he asked a number of questions. "Will you assume this office, believing that the Church's call is God's call to the ministry of Word and Sacrament? Will you therefore preach and teach in accordance with the Holy Scriptures and these creeds and confessions? Will you be diligent in your study of the Holy Scriptures and in your use of the means of grace? Will you pray for God's people, nourish them with the Word and Holy Sacraments, and lead them by your own example in faithful service and holy living? Will you give faithful witness in the world, that God's love may be known in all that you do?

Over the years there have been times when I lose sight of my first love. I lose sight of the healing power of Eucharist, the glory of The Cross, the joy of forgiveness and grace, the promise contained in God's Word. I get so caught up in life that I forget to live – or in Church lingo – I get so caught up in doing the things that need to be done, that I forget to live in the light of Christ's Holy Spirit.

I wonder if that happens to us collectively as Christ's Church as well. We get focused on programs, events, bricks and mortar, service projects and other things that mission can become covered in fog, hidden by distraction.

What is our mission? Very simply, to know Jesus and to make Jesus known into all the world. To go into all the world preaching, teaching, and baptizing in the name of The Father, The Son, and The Holy Spirit. It's important that we have programs – events – a wonderful building – and that we serve. But we do all of that out of the grace of Jesus Christ for the purpose of witnessing to His glory. We must not lose our first love – ever. The love of God, in Christ Jesus our Lord.

I will conclude with a prayer for us that follows the words that +Bp. Black said at the end of all of the questions he asked: "Almighty God, who has given you the will to do these things, graciously give you the strength and compassion to perform them."

Volunteers will gather this Friday, May 20th, to make some of the decorations we will use at VBS
- B. Tent Revival Tent, chair and table rental is completed. The request for road closure has been submitted and is in the process of having city department heads sign off on it. Dates of the Revival will be July 28-30th. Proceeds from the Revival will go toward the SPLC stained glass window restoration. On Sunday, July 31st, worship will take place under the tent! Can't Wait!

DIRT youth will also be meeting this summer to work at the St. Paul's UMC food pantry on June 7, June 21, July 5, July 19, and August 2 from 1-2:30pm.  - a. Information reported in April 19th meeting minutes (9.c.v. listed "... conservative investing with Council approving the following action, for the bequest, to occur: 10% for Tithe, 10% for projects, rest to invest (half in the most conservative plan, other half in a 50/50 mix on Bond/Stock.) Since First Federal Bank does not have a 50/50 mix, the Growth 60/40 Portfolio is the alternative choice.
 - b. Managerial fees for our investment is 1.1% a year which will come out quarterly.
 - c. Shari Wyse, Financial Advisor at First Federal Bank, is with whom we are working with.
- **E.** Tithe Project Status No action taken. Council reps indicated that the previous minutes, reporting out of suggestions made, is appreciated by congregational members.
- **F.** Parker House Demo Quote from Webb Brothers \$14,000. Majority of cost is due to Hauling of materials to the landfill. No further action taken.
- **G.** Narthex Project Rep from Poggemeyer met with Jim regarding enlarging. Due to size of pews the side Doors can remain. A structural engineer will be needed to see if the main doors (underneath balcony) are Load bearing. If so, possibilities of area include moving the walls out and creating decorative encasements around beams/columns... or taking out the Northside stair case...
 - 1. Jim will have Poggemeyer draw up some designs for review at next meeting
 - 2. Current projected estimated cost is \$50K (engineering fees not included) that we could take to bid.
 - 3. Council discussed current changes in usage of Narthex/Main Entrance with regards to Funeral services/procession.
 - a. Currently Funeral homes/services use the West Access ramp.
 - b. Current/Traditional processional has pall bearers navigate Main/North Entrance Steps for dismissal to hearse.
 - (1) Steps are narrow. Currently being reviewed for repair. Age of pall bearer and incline make this action dangerous.
 - c. Enlargement of Narthex could allow for processional from Sanctuary to Back/ North Entrance. When funeral guests are dismissed from church then navigation from Narthex, through sanctuary, to Access Ramp – safer!
 - (1) Pr. Dave will speak to local Funeral Home Directors regarding not using North Steps for future funeral arrangements.
- **H. Windows** Stained Glass & Luther Hall Quote from Leever Glass \$10,500. Jim seeking alternative quote. The windows in Luther Hall would have lower portion glassed, with upper portion enclosed. Still same width.
- I. Air Conditioning Lounge & Luther Hall No phone calls returned. No update. Nancy noted that Council 2006 notes indicated Council making decision to replace an AC unit. This did NOT happen... only parts for the unit were replaced, NOT the entire unit.

- 1. Pr. Dave spoke to Josh & Nikki Huddleston regarding arranging an outing in Fort Wayne. As well as Alex Schmidt and Caitlyn Lay possibly doing something.
- Suggestion of starting back up the Coffee/Cookie/Juice fellowship. Would people sign up? Could be envisioned as 2-4 families/a week responsible for providing snack, starting coffee, and manning the station.... Would this occur between Sunday School

and Worship Service? Could this occur after church? Will Outreach/Discipleship oversee? Ideas to think on.

This is the second time Cathy and I have been part of the process of electing a new Bishop for our Synod. The process is both exciting and at times rather boring but it is also interesting to be part of the conversations among the voting delegates as the election moves forward. Election activities kept us in session until around 10:30 on Thursday night—which is well past bedtime for some of us! With the ecclesiastical method of voting, any name of an ordained pastor in the ELCA, not just Northwestern OH, can be put forth on the first ballot. Many times the front-runner after the first ballot is buried in the middle of the pack following the second ballot results. This year by the time we got to the third ballot, there was a clear-cut front runner and that person became our Bishop-elect Pastor Daniel Beaudoin. The Friday evening tribute and retirement celebration for Bp. Lohrmann brought moist eyes to nearly everyone---it was very touching.

For the ELCA, the presiding Bishop presides over the election process of Synodical Bishops and we can tell you that Bishop Eaton, while strictly attending to the "rules", is a funny and enjoyable person---she kept us laughing and smiling throughout the assembly---thanks be to God for this!

The "Winds of Change" bring new life and with the election of Pr. Beaudoin, we are excited for the Church and for our Synod. There is no reason to think that daily congregational life will need to change—all of us will continue to serve our ministries as before. New things are bound to happen and the direction that God leads us with our new leadership is yet to be seen.

We appreciate being able to represent this congregation at the 2016 Synod Assembly.


