

Peace to all men and women on earth who please him."







1. Pastor's Report: No Report

2. Youth and Family:

- a. Parrish Ed. /Sunday School: Sunday School is underway. Breakfast is being served. We now have two less teachers than last year. Care packages are being packed and sent to our college youth.
- b. VBS: Organization for summer 2017 has begun. We are looking to stay under budget like 2016. Also looking to shift dates.
- c. Tent Revival: YES! We donated \$4,000 in donations to the stained glass repair fund in 2016. We are working on fundraisers for the 2017 Revival. They will be a Thanksgiving Meal on November 6, a Shop-a-thon on Dec. 3, a Chili supper on January 15, and a Potato Bar in March.
- d. Youth: There will be an Addiction Prevention Workshop on October 26th. This event is to give you skills and knowledge about addictive behavior and how to resist it.
- e. Women's Bible Study: Continues twice monthly.
- f. Ministry: "Carrying On" meets monthly.
