As a Pastor I get asked many interesting questions. Many of those questions begin with "Why?"

Why did Jesus say this? Why did God do this in the Old Testament? Why did my loved one die? Why me? Why now? Why here? Why do we do something in worship...

Some of the questions though are "What?" questions.

What was Judas thinking? What does it mean in the Psalms when it says...? What did Luther have to say about?

One of my favorites though is, "Pastor, what is your favorite season?" We actually asked that around the table at our February Maumee Valley Conference Clergy Meeting.

For many of us in the Church that is actually a double question. What season of the year is your favorite? For me, it's always been Fall. The colors, the smell of the air, and even back in the days before it was illegal the smell of burning leaves.

However, in the Church there is a second answer to the favorite season question. Again for me, it's an easy answer. I LOVE LENT.

There is a holy rhythm to Lent, Ashes, prayer, soup suppers, mid week worship, First Communion instruction, Holy Week, stripping the altar on Maundy Thursday, the Solemn Reproaches of Good Friday, the Holy Silence of Easter Saturday.

It feels to me as if the words spoken have a bit more power as we are confronted with the crucifixion of Jesus.

"...that we have sinned by our fault, by our own fault, by our own most grievous fault..."

"Remember you are dust, and to dust you shall return".

"The body of Christ, given for you". "The blood of Christ, shed for you."

"O my people, O my church, what have I done to you? How have I offended you? Answer me"

I invite you to join with the Church throughout the world these next 40 days. Worship, pray, reflect, be moved by the holy rhythm of the season.

### St. Paul Lutheran Congregational Council Minutes February 21,2017 Nancy Krouse, Denise Moog, Shirley Keller, Gaylord Proxm

Attendees: Pastor Dave, Nancy Krouse, Denise Moog, Shirley Keller, Gaylord Proxmire, Julie Sasseen, Jim Ehlinger and 11 St Paul members. Collette Knight was absent.

Meeting was called to order at 6PM by President Krouse.

Jim Martin had asked to address the meeting and opened with a prayer. He wished to express to the council how enriched he and Cathy had been from Jim's service to area Lutheran congregations who are currently without a pastor. He explained there is an acute shortage of pastors, retired pastors and person capable of serving as interim pastors in the Northwest Ohio synod. He and Cathy will continue serving in this capacity and asked the Council and St. Paul congregation to pray for them and the synod.

- 1) Pastor's Report
  - a) Duties of the various Council positions were discussed and job descriptions started by each council member. The job descriptions were collected to be discussed by the council and refined. These descriptions will be used to inform and enlist future council nominees.
  - b) Pastor explained his particular preaching style to the group and read Psalm 130.
  - c) Pastor shared the years of tenure for the St. Paul Pastors starting with Rev. Dodt. There has been reaping cycles of peace and conflict.
  - d) Four letters of support for Pastor Dave were presented to the Council.
  - e) Several members voiced their support for Pastor Dave.
  - f) Pastor Dave will be contacting several church members who have requested a pastoral visit or who has been contacted by Council members indicating that a pastoral visit is warranted.
  - g) Ash Wednesday services will be at Noon and 7PM on March  $1^{st}$ .
  - h) Pastor Dave will be addressing St. Mary's Catholic Church Retreat on March 11<sup>th</sup> by their invitation.

Business meeting was then suspended for lack of a quorum because one of the Council member left the meeting.

- 2) There was no Secretary's Report from the January Council meeting.
- 3) Treasurer's Report
  - a) January's Income was \$19,813.19 with Expenses of \$23,151.11. Negative \$3,337.92.
  - b) \$3,165 was taken from the Deckrosh Legacy Fund to pay for the Arabella St. steps repair.
  - c) Noisy Offering funds \$10,000+ sent to Global Mission. Thank you everyone.
- 4) Youth & Family Director's Report
  - a) The Children are excited about the Noisy Offerings having been sent to Global Mission for the Farms, medical supplies, training, etc. Global Mission has been asked to provide feedback from the recipients and/or some recognition for the gifts from our children and congregation.
  - b) Endowment Funds were pledged for the Youth Gathering (\$3,000), Mawana Youth Tuition (\$1,000), Mawana Youth Weekend Retreat (\$1,000), Recharge (\$750), Parish Education Supplies (\$500) and VBS (\$750).
  - c) Recharge was a huge success with 46 ladies participating in the event.
  - d) During Lent, the Youth will be assisting at the Wednesday night Soup Suppers. New for this year, the Youth will provide "Valet Service" to those preparing the soup. The Valets will be offering to carry the soup from the preparers' car and deliver it to the Church Basement. The Drop Point for the Valet Service will be at the Tower Entrance.
- 5) Discipleship Report
  - a) Work is progressing on securing Lectors & Greeters.

- b) The suggestion was made to ask the Usher's Spouses to be Greeters.
- c) Youth will be asked to participate as Greeters and Lectors.
- 6) Trustee's Report
  - a) Three Building Use Permits were approved by unanimous "consensus" of the Council members present.
  - b) The office copier is approaching the end of its useful life. Replacement? Tabled for now.
  - c) Luther Hall Roof is leaking again near the Tower. Temporary fix in place.
  - d) An inquiry has been made to investigate adding an electric operator to the North Ramp Door. Trustee to solicit a price for one.
  - e) At the Annual meeting, a request was made to add "heat" to the Front Steps when they are replaced this spring. Trustee will inquiry as to the additional cost to add the heaters.
- 7) Old Business
  - a) The Bed Brigade will need a Point Person to chair this program, find a suitable construction site, solicit workers and organize the program. Council will be contacting potential candidates.
- 8) New Business
  - a) The TV camera used to record the Sunday service needs replaced. Local broadcasts temporarily suspended. New unit is ordered at an estimated cost of \$500-700.
  - b) 2016 Giving Statistics were reviewed. We had a small shortfall in funds last year and it is projected there will be a shortfall again this year. Based on last year's giving rate, if each St. Paul household contributed just \$5.00 more per week, we should make budget.
  - c) Six new members will join St. Paul before Easter.

Meeting adjourned with all praying the "Lord's Prayer".

Next Meeting March 21<sup>st</sup> at 6PM. <u>All members Welcome to attend.</u>


