I usually sit down to write the newsletter piece and am done in 10 minutes, today I have sat here staring at the screen for the 30, then typing out a paragraph and taking a little break.

St. Paul Lutheran Congregational Council Minutes August 9, 2017

Attendees: Pastor Dave, Nancy Krouse, Denise Moog, Shirley Keller, Gaylord Proxmire, Jim Ehlinger and Stacy Barker. Collette Knight and Jenny Maag were absent.

Meeting was called to order at 5:31 pm by President Krouse.

Holden Evening service is following this meeting so there were no opening devotions.

1. Pastor's Report

- a) The Norfolk continuing education was very good.
- b) Pastor will be leaving on vacation Aug 13 evening and returning Aug 18.
- c) Tent Revival attendance was over 200 on Friday. Bishop wants to return next year.
- d) NW Ohio synod has requested local congregations look for ways to do joint ministries because of the lack of resources and available clergy.
- e) Last Holden Service will be Aug. 30th.
- f) Normal church schedule starts Sept. 10th.
- g) Catechism begins on Sept. 17th.
- h) Pastor Dave's mother's health continues to decline. Please keep everyone in your prayers

2. There was no Secretary's Report

- a) A resignation letter was received from Collette Knight. Motion made to accept her resignation (Denise/Gaylord). Motion was approved.
- b) Stacy Barker agreed to accept the position. A motion was made to appoint Stacy Barker to the position of Church Council Secretary (Denise/Shirley). Motion was approved. Since the motion was approved and with Stacy in attendance, Pastor installed her as a member of the Church Council.

3. Treasurer's Report

- a) We were negative \$839 for June and positive \$2,064 for July. Still negative year-to-date.
- b) Any financial gains from endowment investments need to be remove from the mnthly income statement.
- c) Duplicator service contract was discussed. A motion was made to cancel the contract (Gaylord/Shirley). Motion was approved.

4. Youth and Family Director's Report

- a) Kidspirit Summer Events are going well with approximately 30 youth from five area churches participating. These events replaced the traditional VBS and have reduced our cost to \$300, a significant savings.
- b) The Youth Group continues to meet weekly.
- c) Seven youth attended the Synod Assembly. Thank you to Stacy Barker and Alex Schmidt.
- d) The Youth group has started a service project by providing "care packages" to the local police, sheriff and dispatchers. Thanks to the congregation for the donated items.
- e) Lori Brandt is training two youth for crucifer and acolyte service.
- f) Rally Day will be Sept. 10th. Backpacks will be blessed and bibles given to kids 3 yrs. and up

5. Discipleship Report

a) Need greeters and lectors for this fall.

6. Stewardship

a) We have \$100+ coming from the Chief tapes collected. Keep'em coming.

7. Trustees Report

- a) The installation of an electric door operator on the North Ramp Door is complete.
- b) The replacement of the front steps of the Church is completed. The contractor performed some corrective actions but the council is not satisfied the results. A motion was made to only pay \$15,000 for the work performed (Jim/Denise). Motion was approved.
- c) We need to find a place to relocate the dumpster. Any ideas where to place it?

d) The two replacement boilers have arrived and are to be installed when the contractor has time to do the work.

8. Old Business

- a) Jeremy Davis has resigned as Church Music Coordinator and Choir Director. A motion was made to accept his resignation (Jim/Stacy). Motion was approved.
- b) Nancy and Jim met with Steve Wendell and he has accepted the position of Church Music Coordinator and Choir Director. A motion was made to confirm his hiring (Shirley/Denise). Motion was approved.
- c) The new Church copier will be delivered by the end of August.

9. New Business

- a) A new Church sign was discussed as a tribute to the Deckrosh's. Tim Moog has some ideas and a commercial sign company will be contacted to get some options on upgrading it.
- b) Nomination committee has met and nominations are going well.
- c) Budget committee will meet Sept. 12th after the regular council meeting.
 d) There will be a "Rededication of our Church" and 500th Year Celebration on Sept. 24th. Stay tuned for more details.
- e) Council discussed new window coverings for Luther Hall. Deb Good will be contacted for ideas and cost.

Next council meeting will be Sept. 12 at 6:00 pm.

Meeting adjourned at 7:00 pm with all present attending the Holden Service.




