

St. Paul Lutheran: Council Meeting Minutes September 12, 2017

Attendance: Pastor Dave Brobston, Nancy Krouse, Jim Ehlinger, Denise Moog, Stacy Barker,

Gaylord Proxmire, Shirley Keller, Jenny Maag, Julie Sasseen, 2 visiting presenters

Meeting called to order at 6:02 pm by Nancy Krouse.

Pastor Dave opened the meeting with prayers and devotion.

1. Visiting Presenters

- a. Tim Moog presented some research he had done with Sign Solutions regarding an option and estimate for updating our sign in the North Lawn. We will continue with discussion of options for updating as a tribute to the Deckrosh Fund.
- b. Tim Moog brought in initial estimates that Jason Frederick gathered for updating the landscaping edging to decorative cement edging.
- c. A lock smith, Wayne Plush, was present to discuss options for re-keying the church.

2. Pastor's Report

- a. Pastoral Acts: Pastor Dave presided at 4 funerals, 1 wedding, and provided 2 death notifications.
- b. Pastor Dave will be representing St. Paul Lutheran Church at the Bishop's Gathering and Bake off on October 17th at St. Stephen Lutheran in Hamler. Everyone is invited. Pastor Dave will be taking the Woman's Recharge Apple Dumplings to enter in the Apple Flavor Bake off.
- c. Other upcoming events:

Interment for Carol Creps - Friday 9/15/17 at 9:00 am.

Confirmation begins 9/17/17

Homecoming – Church Rededication – September 24th Worship

Blessing of the Badges – October 1st 7:00

Blessing of the Pets, Wednesday October 4th at 6:45. Youth are encouraged to bring their pets to youth group on this date, along with an adult to help with their pet(s).

- d. Thank you to everyone for their support during his mother's passing. Shared appreciation for the flowers that were sent on the behalf of St. Paul's.
- e. Multiple visits to Hospice, Hospital, Nursing Home/Rehab.
- f. Fall Schedule is underway.
- g. Pastor Dave has been invited to attend the FBI Citizens Academy on Thursday evenings in Toledo for 6 weeks beginning October 5th. He was also invited to serve on the Mayor's "Defiance Community Strategic Planning Team" but had to decline because of previous commitment to the FBI Citizen's Academy.

3. Treasurer's Report

- a. Council discussed creating a Capital Improvement's Fund that will be funded 50% donations/50% Deckrosh Fund.
- b. Total income for August 2017: \$17,999.04, Total Expense for August 2017: \$20,600.73 YTD we are -\$5,439.18. It is anticipated the shortfall will be recovered as attendance picks back up this fall.

4. Youth and Family

- a. Wednesday night youth groups have started back up with 4 groups running this year.
- b. October 22nd there will be a Reformation German Dinner held after worship service.
- c. October 1st at 7:00 Blessing of the Badges. Julie is volunteering to organize a reception following and is looking for other volunteers to help.

5. Discipleship:

- a. The service time change has been submitted to the paper.
- b. Working on plans for receptions for the Re-dedication on September 22nd and the Reformation Celebration on October 29th.
- c. Plans are underway to get together to discuss getting new Deacon's Robes and possibly new acolyte robes or to have some altered to fit some of the new acolytes.

6. Stewardship

a. Getting Envelopes ordered.

7. Trustee Report

- a. Will be getting final pricing on re-keying building.
- b. A building use request was submitted by Joan Sierra for October 22nd from 12-4 pm for the rotary room. The rotary room will not be available due to the Reformation German Dinner being held that day. Luther Hall will be offered as an option instead.
- c. Will be working on getting quotes for a digital sign from Sign Solutions as a possible secondary sign.
- d. Discussed the landscaping edging that was presented at the beginning of the meeting. It was decided to table the vote until Spring. Discussion of adding the Landscaping Edging expense to the list of items that may be covered by the Capital Improvements 50/50 Fund.

8. Old Business

- a. Condolences offered to Pastor Dave after the passing of his mother.
- b. Nominating Committee still needs one person for the ballot and there is still a position open for Stewardship on the ballot. The rest of the slate has been filled. It was noted that it was great to see the congregation members eagerly agree to the nominations for 2018 council.
- c. Lutheran World Relief collections are still coming in to support hurricane recovery efforts. The total is over \$2,000 so far.
- d. Jim Ehlinger made the motion to change the Stewardship position to a one year term in order to help with balancing the council with one year and two year term members and avoid too many out going members in the same year. Motion was seconded by Denise Moog.

9. New Business

- a. Budget and Election Meeting will be held on November 19th following service.
- b. After the Budget and Election Meeting there will be a brief discussion regarding the Deckrosh tithes. Council will present tithing options.
- c. Nancy proposed to take a vote to approve the current ballot with the positions where nominations are filled. (Denise/Gaylord) All in favor.
- d. Discussion over the Duplicator. The contract is paid through August 2018. The contract will be terminated at that time.
- e. Discussed need for updating the office phone system. There have been continued technical issues. Gaylord will be looking into options for updating.

Budget Committee to meet immediately following Council Meeting.

Next Council Meeting will be October 10th at 6:00 pm.

Meeting adjourned at 8:25 pm.

from a drinking song is probably from a misunderstanding of the tune. Without a long explanation, the term 'bar form' does not mean it has anything to do with a pub but is a technical musical term dealing with the style of the stanzas used in the medieval German language. For more information, Google it and you can read a lot more about the history of a very familiar and favorite hymn for many congregations.





FLASH BACK...SERVICE GUILD 1953


June 15, 1953

A meeting of the Ladies of the Church was held Monday evening, June 15, 1953 to discuss the purchase of a church organ. Our present organ was purchased in 1893 at a cost of \$700.00. After seeing and hearing several organs Rev. Hax and Mrs. Marjorie Sisco explained the different makes and quoted prices. After much discussion a motion was made by Mrs. Dorrence Arps and seconded by Mrs. Marie Kammeyer to order a Schantz organ, made at Orrville, Ohio, priced at \$8,450 and the old organ, allowing between\$200.00 and \$250.00 for it., and chimes at an additional \$600, 10% to accompany order, 40% during construction, and balance when delivered.

A committee consisting of Edna Healless, Helen Murphy and Pauline Bauman was appointed to purchase a set of dishes.

Three haulaway carts were purchased in May 1953 at \$60.00 each, making a total of \$180 plus \$2.63 delivery charges.


