Brothers and Sisters in Christ, Grace to you and peace from God our Father and our Lord Jesus Christ. Amen.

Looking Back at 2017 there were many joys and more than a few sorrows. The Revival continues to grow and it was a true joy to have Bishop Beaudoin here to preach on Friday night. Thanks to the Dekrosh funds we have been able to do many projects that kept getting pushed ahead and it had become critical that we take care of them before they turned into a critical emergency. The Noisy Offering and the joy of the Global Barnyard with our youth continues to be exciting for the young and the young at heart.

However, on a personal note, mom's illness and eventual death made the last half of 2017 difficult. Once again I want to thank the congregation for your notes, thoughts, and prayers as we walk together. Looking ahead to 2018 on a personal level I can joyfully say that Nicole will be graduating from Roanoke in May and either heading to Germany as a Fulbright Scholar or heading to grad school. No more tuition checks to write is why I have a bit of a bigger smile this Christmas season.

Looking ahead in the parish Bishop Beaudoin has called for 2018 to be The Year of Prayer for the Northwestern Ohio Synod. Our Synodical Bible Study will be centered around the Book of Nehemiah. Nehemiah was the Cup Bearer for King Artaxerxes. In his position he had heard that there was a remnant in Jerusalem and he petitioned the king to return and rebuild the walls and the city. Nehemiah's ministry – while very practical in the ways of logistics and engineering – was centered in and around constant prayer. Once again we will gather together on Sunday evenings during Lent to study together and pray together.

Also, modeling Nehemiah, we will be having 4 "Pray Day" Saturdays at St. Paul's. We will also open this to other congregations to join us each quarter. The morning will start with refreshments at 845, some teaching about prayer and a specific type of prayer at 9, a short break at 945, then from 10-11 we will take time to pray at various places around the church or in the community. We will gather back together at 11 for a few minutes of discussion and be on our way by 1130. The first of those will be Saturday morning March 3rd so keep your eyes open for more information coming up.

I've had a couple of questions about the language change by the Synod, the Bishop and others from "congregation" language to "parish" language. First, I was trained in Parish ministry, not congregational ministry while on internship. A Parish includes the congregation or congregations but extends beyond the doors and parking lots into the community. Think about Louisiana, they don't have counties – but parishes. By thinking that way, we grow to understand that our call as the people of God isn't just when we gather to worship behind closed doors, but when we work, golf, boat, and live with God's people in the Parish.
