The Prophet Isaiah pens in the 43rd Chapter:

**“Remember not the former things, nor consider the things of old.
Behold, I am doing a new thing; now it springs forth, do you not perceive it?
I will make a way in the wilderness and rivers in the desert.”**

It's that time of the year when we have just completed compiling statistics and putting together reports. The Annual Meeting is in the rear view mirror, the 2018 Council has been installed and we begin to look forward.

As we spoke of at the Annual Meeting we are looking for those new things that God is up to, we are looking for that river in the desert trusting that God is doing amazing things in our lives, in our midst, within our worshiping community and within our parish. Folks, God is at work!

Speaking of new things! Let's take a quick look at things on the horizon. On Wednesday, February 7th I invite any of our adults to gather with our youth as we burn the Palms from last Palm Sunday to make Ash. Ash Wednesday is February 14th and we will gather at noon and 7 for worship and the imposition of Ashes.

Then, as we did last Lent we will gather beginning at 6 pm on Sunday February 18th at COSMOS for the Bishop's Bible Study on Nehemiah and Prayer. (NOTE THE NEW LOCATION). We will be meeting with our 2nd graders and others to plan for First Communion on Maundy Thursday (March 29th).

With St. Paul's United Methodist currently without a called Pastor, I will be working with Marcella Ciccotelli to help plan the Community Good Friday Worship Service beginning at noon. I also have been in conversation with Deacon Jeff Mayer about the Stations of the Cross walk beginning from St. Mary's Roman Catholic Church at 3 pm. Good Friday this year is on March 30th.

Also, coming on March 3rd will be our first Saturday morning prayer gathering – We will plan to meet in Luther Hall at 9 AM and have some conversation about prayer, then experience a couple of different types of prayer. At our first gathering we will take a look at Taize prayer and The Lutheran version of The Rosary (YES, we have a type of prayer that goes along with Prayer Beads or a Rosary.)

Our Wednesday evening gathering will begin on Feb 21st. We will gather for Soup and Fellowship at 6:00 followed by Holden Evening Prayer at 6:45. We will be looking at the Minor Prophets this year, so plan to bring your Bibles as we dive into God's word. The schedule is:

4. Youth and Family

a. Noisy Offering Collection: \$2,418.57 With tithing match of \$7,500, the grand total to be given to Global Barnyard is \$9,918.56. The youth will be meeting January 10th to make decisions about which gifts will be purchased. All are welcome to attend and watch the youth make their selections and assist them with their budgeting. Council provided approval to round up the dollar amount if needed to make it easier for the kids to balance their purchases.

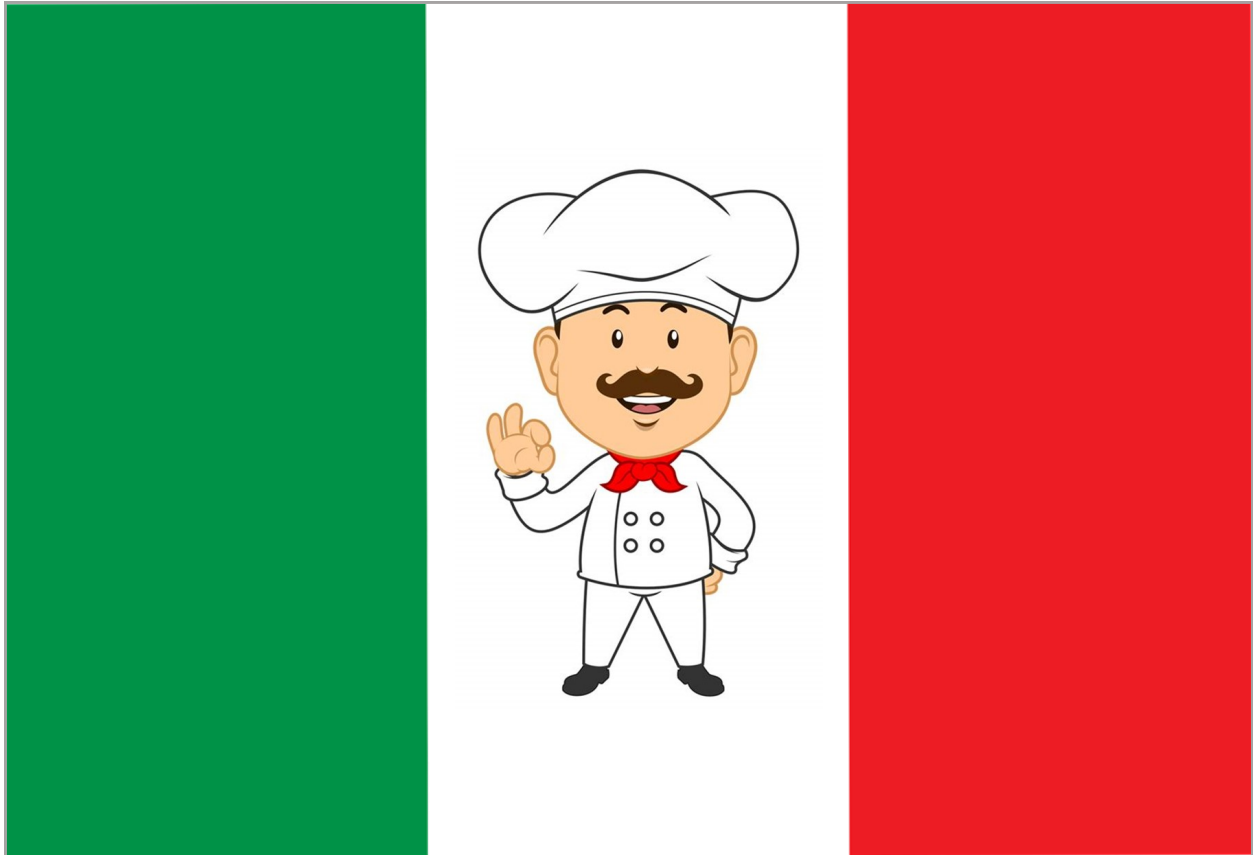

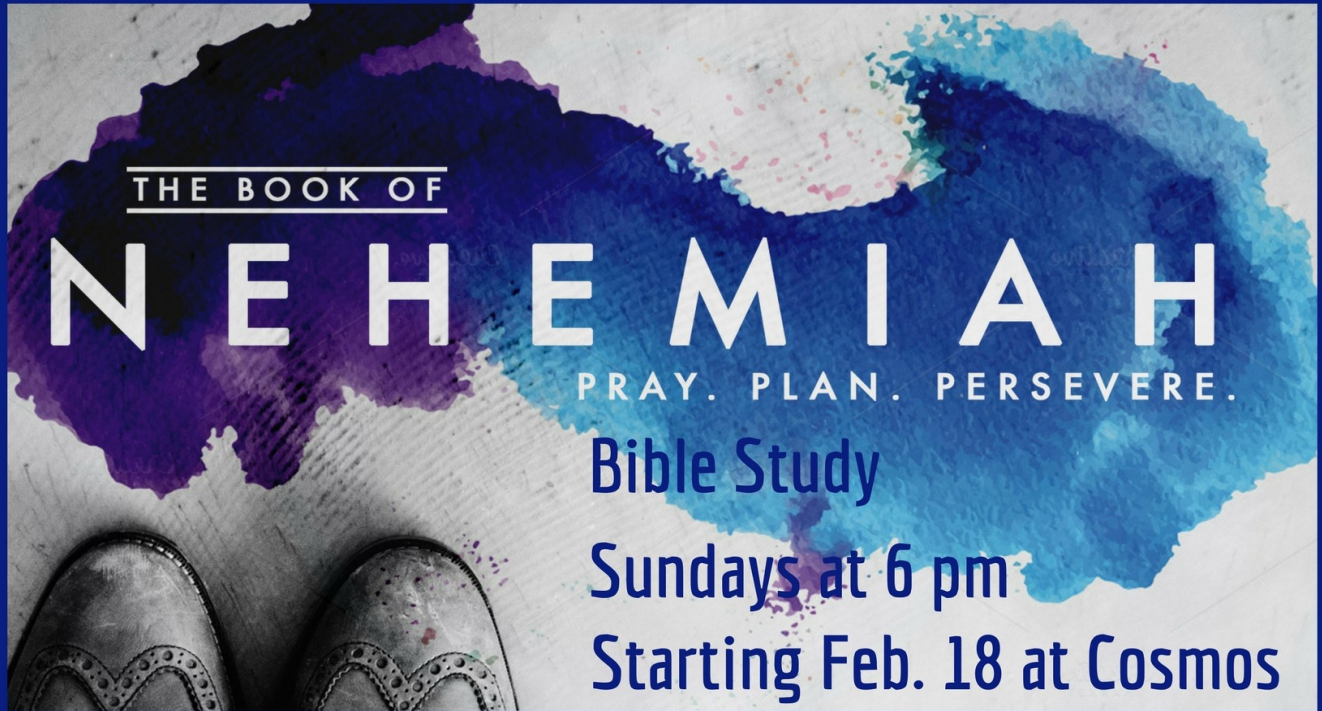

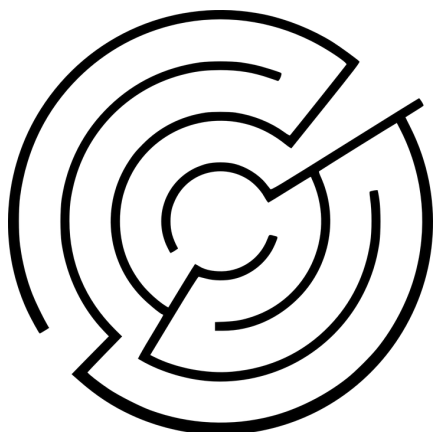
