Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Grace to you and peace from God our Father and our Lord Jesus Christ. Amen.

When +Bishop Alex Black ordained me many years ago at First Lutheran in Parkersburg he asked me, "What Scripture verse gets you through the difficulties of life?"

My answer was quick and certain, "Bishop," I said, "Galatians 2:20 – It is no longer I who live but Christ who lives in me." He smiled and nodded, but there was almost a bemused look in his eyes as he did. He didn't say anything else about it, but I have always been curious about what the look might have meant.

25 years later and I think I may have a clue. For you see, if I was asked the same question today my answer would be quite different. Instead of Galatians 2:20 I would respond, "Mark 9:24 as the father of the boy cries out, "I believe, help my unbelief."

Mark tells this wonderful story just after Jesus and the disciples come down from the mountain on which James, Peter, and John saw Jesus transfigured.

When they came to the disciples, they saw a great crowd around them, and some scribes arguing with them. When the whole crowd saw him, they were immediately overcome with awe, and they ran forward to greet him. He asked them, "What are you arguing about with them?" Someone from the crowd answered him, "Teacher, I brought you my son; he has a spirit that makes him unable to speak; and whenever it seizes him, it dashes him down; and he foams and grinds his teeth and becomes rigid; and I asked your disciples to cast it out, but they could not do so." He answered them, "You faithless generation, how much longer must I be among you? How much longer must I put up with you? Bring him to me." And they brought the boy to him. When the spirit saw him, immediately it convulsed the boy, and he fell on the ground and rolled about, foaming at the mouth. Jesus asked the father, "How long has this been happening to him?" And he said, "From childhood. It has often cast him into the fire and into the water, to destroy him; but if you are able to do anything, have pity on us and help us." Jesus said to him, "If you are able!—All things can be done for the one who believes." Immediately the father of the child cried out, "I believe; help my unbelief!" Mark 9:14-24

I think perhaps in his wisdom Bishop Black knew that the brash faith of that young man he was about to ordain would change and mature throughout his life. I think he knew that faith would be tested and that there would be dark nights of the soul. I think perhaps he wanted to pat that young would be pastor on the head and say, "There there son, someday you will see more clearly."

Many television preachers say that a Christian should never have doubts, yet Thomas did. Many say that a Christian should never deny, yet Peter did. Many say that a Christian should never question, yet Paul did. Many say that faith should never waiver, yet for all of the giants of faith that we read about in history from Augustine, to Luther, to Bonhoeffer there were times of waivering faith. To doubt, to question, to waiver IS faith.

My prayer for us all as we journey towards the cross this Lenten season is this, "Lord, we believe, help our unbelief."







Prayer is still transforming lives every day.






