

For years when asked where I am from I have said, "I live in Ohio" or "I live in Michigan" or "I live in Illinois – but I am FROM West Virginia." West Virginia was home, that's where I was born, that's where I was raised, that's where I spent my first 23 years of life – West Virginia was home. There is even a tattoo on my right shoulder blade of West Virginia with the state motto "Montani Semper Liberi" and my mother's maiden name, "Turley" permanently reminding me of home.

That being said, since last year when mom and two of her sisters died and more of the family is scattered than ever, the place doesn't feel like home. I feel like I am passing through, a visitor, a guest and often times I guess I am. On our way to Continuing Education events, or to see Nicole. It just doesn't feel the same in my spirit.

However, there is something that does feel the same. These big group texts with my cousins, aunts and uncles. A Facebook thread that starts about fried chicken and moves through me telling my cousins that I'm sorry that I got all of the brains and the good looks and they got the scraps from the family tree, but it always ends the same. Love – there is something about love that makes me long for home, even though I now feel like a visitor when I go there.

I often wonder if there are folks out there that feel that way about church. Are there people that get up on a Sunday, get dressed, and drive by and see folks talking and laughing in the parking lot and feel like they just won't fit in? Are there folks that set their alarm on Saturday night, get up on Sunday and just can't bring themselves to come back to worship because they are embarrassed they haven't been to a church in many years? Are there folks that are just waiting, hiding behind messages and texts to have an invitation to come to church? Are there neighbors of yours that see you pull in to your driveway on a Sunday, look out their window and wish that you'd invite them?

In Romans 10:14 St. Paul talks about just this thing. Eugene Peterson in his version for modern day entitled "The Message" tells it this way. "But how can people call for help if they don't know who to trust? And how can they know who to trust if they haven't heard of the One who can be trusted? And how can they hear if no-body tells them? And how is anyone going to tell them, unless someone is sent to do it? That's why Scripture exclaims, A sight to take your breath away! Grand processions of people telling all the good things of God! But not everybody is ready for this, ready to see and hear and act. Isaiah asked what we all ask at one time or another: "Does anyone care, God? Is anyone listening and believing a word of it?" The point is: Before you trust, you have to listen. But unless Christ's Word is preached, there's nothing to listen to."

Friends, I believe that we all know someone who doesn't feel safe coming home. A bad experience, too many years away, embarrassment, uncertainty. How are they to hear? How are they to come without invitation? How are they to know unless we invite.

Take a risk this summer, be strong in the Lord, and invite someone "home."
