September 2018,

Our neighborhood is growing up. When we moved in 11 years ago there weren't a lot of kids in the neighborhood the age of our kids. Some older, many were babies. The neighborhood got to grow up with us – the joys and sorrows of driving and the bumps and bruises that go along with it. Then the joy and sorrow of graduations, off to college and back, and then

jobs and careers. As I have turned around it seems as if we have become the more senior folks on the block. As difficult as that is to admit, there is a bit of good news in it too. Now, I get to talk to the high schoolers in the neighborhood and in the congregation; the volleyball players, the cross country runners and the football players. I get to live vicariously through their eyes without being the parent worrying about practice schedules and injuries, about the heartache of a tough loss or the teenage over reaction to a great win. I kind of get to watch from a distance without all of the emotional investment. I need to admit it's kind of nice.

In those 11 years many things have changed – I just recorded my halftime show for the first football broadcast of the year. On the show I talked about a major change in the last 11 years, the number of kids dressing for high school football has declined 28%. 28% since my family moved to Defiance. Everything seems to be shrinking around us. Rotary attendance, the number employed at GM, worship numbers, and now the number of kids playing football.

Like I said, I'm blessed through being a Pastor, a broadcaster, a lover of sports - - and having Guinness to be able to talk to a number of young folks in and around the area. With all of the changes we experience, there is one thing that hasn't changed for these young athletes this time of year. Their HOPE. Everybody today is 0-0 – Everybody is in first place – the realities good or bad haven't yet come to the surface. I ask each young person how they think they are going to do this season. In all of my 11 years here I have yet to have a player say, "Sheesh, Pastor, we are going to be awful." or "Really, Sir – I'm just out here for something to do, we are going to have a terrible season." However, you and I know if we pull up the records for some of the teams in the area over the past 11 years, there have been some bad records. Yes, we have a State Champion or a few to be proud of, but we also have some really, really bad seasons. But, in all of those years not one athlete has lost hope before the season .

I know what you are thinking, "Okay PD – your point is?" The point is, each of these athletes are putting their hope on one another, their coaches, their talent. During the same 11 years as I have talked athletes I have also talked to Christians, Church Folks, Church Experts, Bishops, Pastors, YOU – and honestly when I look in the mirror I haven't heard or felt that same hope. There is a spirit of scarcity, a demon of doubt, a devil of despair. Why is that brothers and sisters? Where are we putting our hope and our faith? Is it on another program, or project? Is it on a Bishop or Pastor? Is it on Council or Choir? Or is our faith and hope focused on the one that promises that "I am with you always, til the end of the age? Is our hope on the one who loves us to the place that nothing in all of creation can separate us from His love? Do we truly trust Jesus?

For the truth is, teammates will let us down, programs and projects will run out of steam, Bishops and Pastors will come and go, Councils and Choirs will fall short – but the love of God, the hope of Christ will never fail, will never disappoint, will never let us down. May our Fall be a Fall of hope – of faith – of love – of following... following the One who was, who is, and who is to come.




