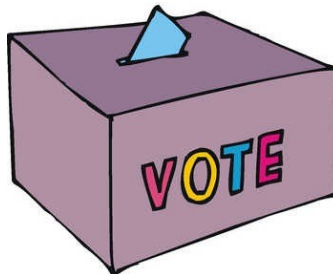

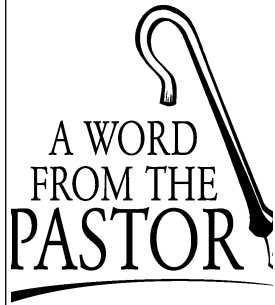

Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Grace to you and peace from God our Father and our Lord Jesus Christ. Amen.

If you remember last month's Pastor's note we talked about Pantry Soup. Well, this month is going to be a bit more Pantry Stew. In the last month or so I have been asked a couple of questions that I think bear being shared with a wider audience.

Pastor, can you help explain a couple of the changes to the Proposed Constitution such as Chapter 20 and the new language about “Rostered Leaders?”

A. First, the new Chapter is an attempt to put language in place for congregational mergers. Folks, this will be the way of the future. Declining population + declining worship numbers + a massive shortage of clergy are going to make mergers and partnerships the way of the future. This year we saw the birth of the Williams County Lutheran Parish – a marriage of Trinity and First in Bryan along with St. Peter's in Edon. This is the first of what will be many opportunities for cooperation throughout the Synod and the ELCA. This new language will allow congregations to move forward without a need to reinvent the wheel every time it occurs, and it will occur. The truth is, as an economist when I look at demographic trends, congregational trends, and clergy shortage in Defiance Country, St. Paul's will some day be a part of a Parish partnership. Whether that is with other ELCA congregations, or with Full Communion partners or both is the great unknown. The hard truth is, congregations will need to find ways cooperate in order to survive and have the ability to call a “Rostered Leader.” I know that +Bp Beaudoin has been very intentional using the word “Parish” instead of “Congregation” recently. That reminds us to begin to think and see in a bigger picture kind of way, to look at those around our community and to also begin to think in terms of partnerships and cooperative ministries as we can.

B. Second, to discuss why the language change from Pastor to “Rostered Leader”. What exactly is a “Rostered Leader?” In short, I am. When the ELCA was formed it inherited various forms of diaconal ministers from it's predecessor bodies. It has taken over 25 years to sort out language, rites of commission, guidelines and function to those rosters. What was common among the Lutheran Church in America, the American Lutheran Church, and the Association of Evangelical Lutheran Churches was the role of “Pastor” - the Pastor has always been a “Minister of Word and Sacrament” - that has been a phrase used for decades. While the role of deacon, deaconess, diaconal minister have been based around “Minister of Word and Service” truly defining their role and how they were commissioned was always a source of debate. In the Roman Catholic and Anglican tribes, deacons are ordained – as are Bishop's. For Lutherans, ordination has been a rite strictly reserved for Ministers of Word and Sacrament/Pastors. For 25 years this has been studied and debated and finally decided. We now “consecrate” Ministers of Word and Service and they are called Deacons. This causes us to change some of our Constitutional language so that our former use of the word deacon is not mistaken for the legal rostered title of Deacon as understood by the larger Church.

I hope that these help answer some questions as you navigate the revisions to the Constitution as we near a time to meet to discuss and vote on the document.

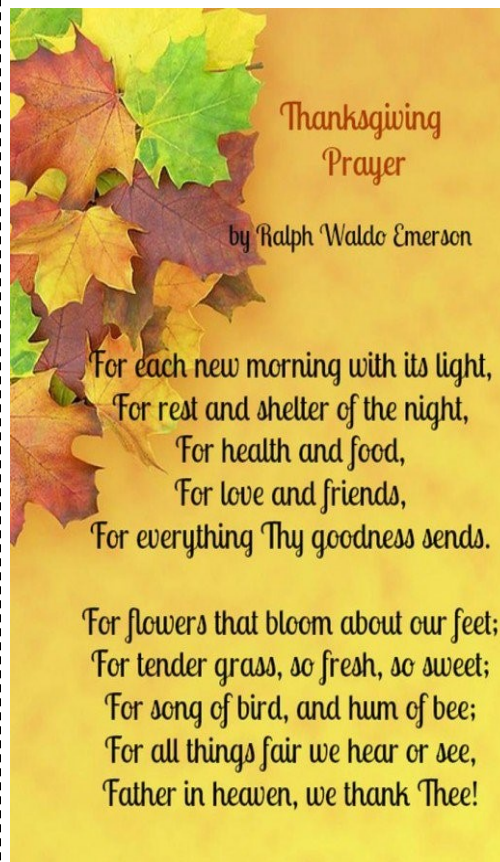
