

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

October 2018

Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ. Amen.

This is my favorite time of year. I absolutely love Autumn. Football, the temperatures, the beauty of leaves changing, the smell and sound of fallen leaves under foot, the crackle of the first fire on a frosty night - - - and I know this will surprise you. SOUP SEASON. Today as I sit to write this month's article I am thinking about what my grandmother called Pantry Soup. Pantry soup was just that, whatever you had in the pantry, freezer, refrigerator went in the soup. It never quite tasted the same way twice, but was always warm and comforting on a crisp autumn afternoon. That's what my letter today is going to be – Pantry Soup from Pastor.

We have come through the summer as most congregations do with not enough giving to keep up with the bills. We are a bit behind where we need to be to make budget by the end of the year. The last couple of weeks since Rally Day have seen improvement but we are still running about \$10,000 behind. I know it looks like a lot, but it's really fairly common for us and others. However, with October coming I want to encourage and remind folks so that we can close the gap before the winter months begin to close in. We have always come through and there is no doubt in my mind that God's faithfulness to provide for all of our needs will have us catching up in no time, but it never hurts for a friendly reminder before we need a panicked plea!

Our second prayer retreat will be coming up on October 20th. We are going to take a look at labyrinth prayer and walking prayer. Taking a look at some of the Psalms, Joshua and the prayers while walking around Jericho, exploring the labyrinth and how we pray the labyrinth and a walking prayer of the neighborhood around St. Paul's. We will begin in Luther Hall at 9 AM and wrap things up at 11:00 AM.

Blessing of the Pets. Wednesday Evening October 10th we will gather for the Annual Blessing of the Pets at 6:00 around the sign and Stone Altar. Come join us and invite your neighbors as we gather for Prayer and for the Blessing of God's Creation.

Thanksgiving Eve-Eve — We will be hosting Thanksgiving Eve once again this year for the community. However, we will be moving the service from Wednesday night to Tuesday night November 20th. In years past some folks have asked for that because many are already in the midst of meal prep on Wednesday evening and this year Kayly and I will be traveling on Wednesday to Arizona to enjoy Nicole's first holiday away from home with her.

The Budget and Elections Meeting will take place Sunday, November 18th immediately following worship. Please be praying for all of those that will be on the ballot and that the Holy Spirit will be stirring our hearts and calling folks to those positions of leadership.



- e. Lines are sagging again where the truck took them down before. Jim will check to see what it will take to get it raised or flagged.


