Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Grace to you and peace from God our Father and our Lord Jesus Christ. Amen.



Growing up with a May birthday I always loved the saying, "April showers bring May flowers" - to me that meant that beauty would be springing up all around my birthday. I mean, what spoiled only child wouldn't think that, right? As I grew I realized that along with May flowers there were also difficult times like April Mud, or late Spring floods. With the good of flowers and crops and the bad of mud or flood I still love a nice spring rain, one of those rains that you can smell coming, those dark blue gray skies you can see, the roll of thunder you can hear and feel.

In a previous conversation a pastor I worked with used to say at Baptisms, "I promise that these baptismal waters will cause your child to skip right by the terrible twos or troubled threes." He said it with a chuckle, but he said it every Baptism. I need to admit I would sit up front, in the view of everyone and just shake my head. I was a Pastor who looked more like a disinterested acolyte at times, there is my confession for the month.

We all know that Baptism doesn't prevent tough times in our lives. We all know that Baptism doesn't prevent our children from going through those tough years growing up, we all know that Baptism doesn't keep us from having those difficult times in our lives.

Luther said much about Baptism that informs us about how our Baptism impacts our daily life. In the Small Catechism Luther encourages the Christian to return to our Baptism each and every day. "In the morning, as soon as you get out of bed, you are to make the sign of the holy cross and say: 'God the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit watch over me. Amen."

For us as Lutheran Christians, according to Luther Baptism "signifies that the old creature in us ... is to be drowned and die through *daily* ... repentance, and ... that *daily* a new person is to come forth and arise up to live before God in righteousness and purity forever."

You heard that right. DAILY! Baptism is not something we do one time where water is poured on us and a Pastor proclaims that we are Baptized in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Baptism for us is a daily event, something that renews our life and faith, something that gives us new life. Truly, we are Born Again each and every day.

Even with the mud and floods of life, we have the promise of daily rebirth. Even with storms and struggles that we face each day, we have the promise of God's presence with us. Each and every day we have that reminder that we who were once no people are now God's people, a holy nation, a royal priesthood. Thanks be to God for the gift of Baptism.






Our HOPE at the conference is to transform their hearts, minds and souls.
