



Meeting Called to Order at 6:05 pm. Pastor Dave opened the meeting with prayer and devotion.

#### 1. Pastor's Report

- Pastor thanks everyone for their prayers for Guinness, Pastor Dave's Service Dog. Medications are working and he does not have cancer.

- Stop the Bleed kit still needs ordered
- Wi-Fi upper level Chad is the person who will be installing our wi-fi. He will be doing it in stages, starting with the upstairs and finishing with the basement. Approximately \$1000 each. A church account is being set up with New Egg in order to be able to use our tax exempt status on materials. We are waiting on their response to order supplies.

**Ministry:** Progressively transform our current Sunday School area into a Community Area with the goal being to provide a modern, cohesive, warm, welcoming environment for members and visitors alike, to encourage God's family to sit, relax, and talk in God's house.

In addition to the transformation of the classrooms, we will work on other steps toward welcoming visiting families into our St. Paul family.

Welcome brochures will be placed in the pews to introduce our staff, including their portraits and will also include some brief information on different ministries we hold dear at St. Paul.

Another pew insert will include a welcome to families with small children in worship with encouragement to help them feel more comfortable raising their growing family in our church pews.

Sinage will also be going up through out the church to help our guests better navigate through the building.

#### **Funding Ideas:**

Vision Boards for Sponsorships: Vision boards with pictures and pull away donation envelopes for items that need purchased with estimated cost for each item will be displayed in the front left of the sanctuary. Sponsors can take an envelope from the board and submit it with their donation for that particular item or provide a general monetary donation.

Fundraisers - Additional fundraisers will take place during the duration of the project.

**Stage 1:** Chapel Conversion - Turn the Sunday school room on the east side of the basement into a chapel area. Primary use would be for our youth on wednesday evenings, but could be utilized by anyone for quiet prayer and reflection.

Stage 2: Large Sunday School Area Transformation: Paint Basement for a more modern, welcoming, homey feel (coordinate color with current flooring).

Take down the old accordion partitions.


**Stage 3:** Family Room - Create a comfortable "Family Room" area in part of the open space of the basement. Coordinating couches, ottomans, chairs, dnd stands, large white board that can double as a projector screen, projector/DVD player, blue tooth speaker, book rack with christian lit. and devotions for all ages to borrow and bring back or read while sitting.

**Stage 4:** Coffee Bar – Create a small coffee bar with refreshments available for families as they come in to church on Sunday mornings, encouraging parents and other church family to sit and have fellowship while their little ones are enjoying Sunday School or while waiting for the Worship Service to start.

**Stage 5:** Fellowship - In one of the partitions create a cafe seating area with three small tables with four chairs at each. This space can be used for fellowship, or even during Sunday School. Craft supplies for Sunday School/Youth Activities will be stored in this area.

**Stage 6:** Dining Room – In another partition we would have a large dining area with a more homey dining table to seat 12. Service Guild would still have an area to dine, but this area could continue to be used for Sunday School or for youth on Wednesday nights to gather to work on projects or play games.


