Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Grace to you and peace from God our Father and our Lord Jesus Christ. Amen.

Welcome to Autumn! Or as we see this year in Ohio, Third Summer. We have a busy month ahead of us. We will be Blessing Pets on Wednesday evening October 9th in recognition of The Feast of St. Francis. We will be taking Directory Photos at the end of the month. We will be celebrating Reformation Sunday. It's going to be a busy month.

I wanted to take a minute and talk about Reformation. Not just The Reformation, lead by Luther 502 years ago but simply Reformation. Scripture tells us, "But now, O Lord, You are our Father; we are the clay, and You our potter; and all we are the work of Your hand." (Isaiah 64:8) There is something special about being molded and remolded or formed and reformed throughout our lives. Being reformed is not always pleasant, it can be uncomfortable, it may be downright painful – it is never convenient, but what comes out on the other side is often stronger than the original and in the hands of God is perfect for the mission of God's Church.

I think back to a bad break of my tibia. It was miserable, it was summer – hot – young kids – heavy cast up to my hip for many weeks, then a short cast, then a walking boot – riding in the back of the van because I couldn't bend my leg – and in the days before doctors realized the side effects of opioid pain meds I was on way too much Vicodin. It was a miserable summer, maybe more miserable for Kayly than for me because I spent much of the summer in a Vicodin haze. (The sermons that summer were interesting to say the least.)

However, as the doctor told me, the calcium being reformed around the break would make my leg stronger than ever. He also said that I would be able to predict the rain and that would be an uncomfortable reminder of the injury. It's true, I can feel the reformed bone when I run my hand down my shin. The bone is stronger now than it was 20 years ago and yes there is a little reminder from time to time that I was changed.

God formed us, and reforms us for the Mission of The Gospel. The gifts we once had may fade, and be replaced by new gifts for the Mission. You see, for God, that is always paramount. The Mission of the Gospel, to preach, to invite, to save. If you had asked me when I started seminary if I would ever see our worship services on YouTube every week I would have asked what YouTube or even the internet was. We reform some of the ways we do ministry because the world is changing around us. What doesn't change is The Truth of God. "For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life. Indeed, God did not send the Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through him."

May we be formed and reformed to carry out that Gospel Mission.

For the Kitchen help, the times are 8am till about 1:30pm.

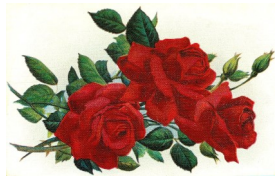

1. Pastor's Report

a. Review of Upcoming Events:

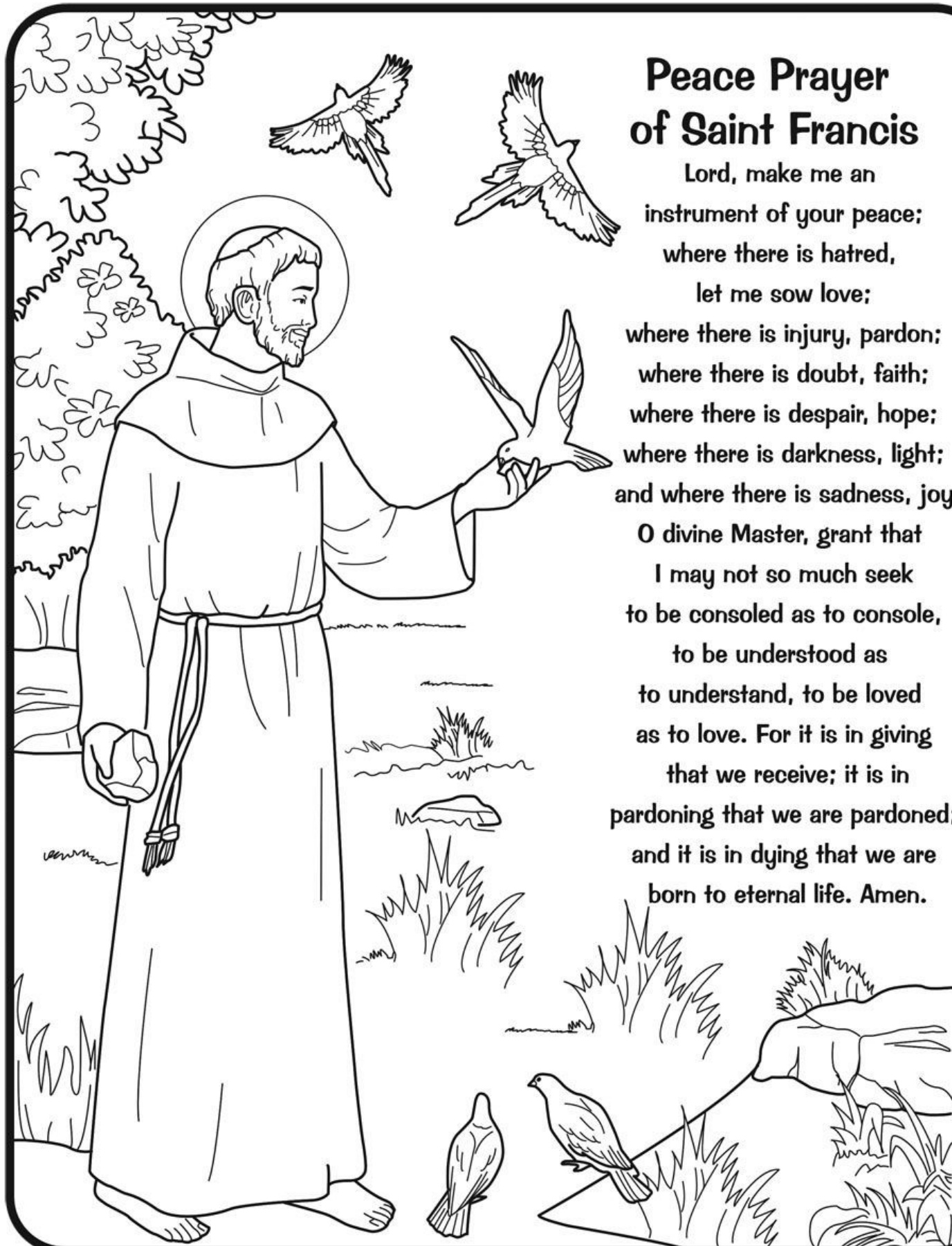
