Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Grace to you and peace from God our Father and our Lord Jesus Christ. Amen.

A blessed Advent to you all!

I recently had a chance to preach at my internship parish in South Dakota. It was a true joy to be back to a place that had done so much to help mold and shape my pastoral identity. When I arrived there in August of 1991 I thought I knew it all – I thought that I had all it took to be "Pastor." By January 2<sup>nd</sup>, 1992, as I stood in a neurological unit with parents making the decision whether or not to remove life support for their daughter I realized that I was no where near ready for that title. I realized by the week after Easter where I presided at three funerals in two days after a full Holy Week and Easter that I had no idea what it meant to proclaim grace when I myself was so exhausted. I realized as Doctor Purintun ordered me to 5 days of rest that I had no idea what it meant to take care of myself. That place, those people helped me bridge that gap between student and pastor.

Isn't that a lot like Advent? I mean we are all anticipating the amazing birth in that sacred manger on Christmas Eve – all while Matthew's Gospel keeps coming at us with words of the 2<sup>nd</sup> Coming of Christ – all while the world tells us we should have been Christmas shopping in October. There is this incredible tension between what was, what is, and what will be. As I sit looking at the Gospel texts for the season of Advent I realize that it stands in stark contrast to what I see of an evening on the Hallmark Channel. It doesn't match the narrative of Black Friday and the consumer Christmas that we are sold. For me, Advent is the season of the Church Year that stands most against the pressures of the world.

The world tells us hurry up, go here and rush there. Advent tells us to be still and wait.

The world tells us to be bigger and brighter and get more. Advent tells us to light one candle and be happy with less.

The world tells us to move faster and do more. Advent tells us to anticipate the birth and the second coming and to slow down and watch for Messiah.

The world tells us that we deserve more and better gifts. Advent tells us that the wages of our gluttony and sin is death and that we don't get the death we deserve, but the true gift of Eternal life through Christ.

I pray that your Advent is blessed with both family and friends and time to be still. I pray that you can walk in that tension of waiting, of anticipating, of expecting that incredible gift of Jesus.






